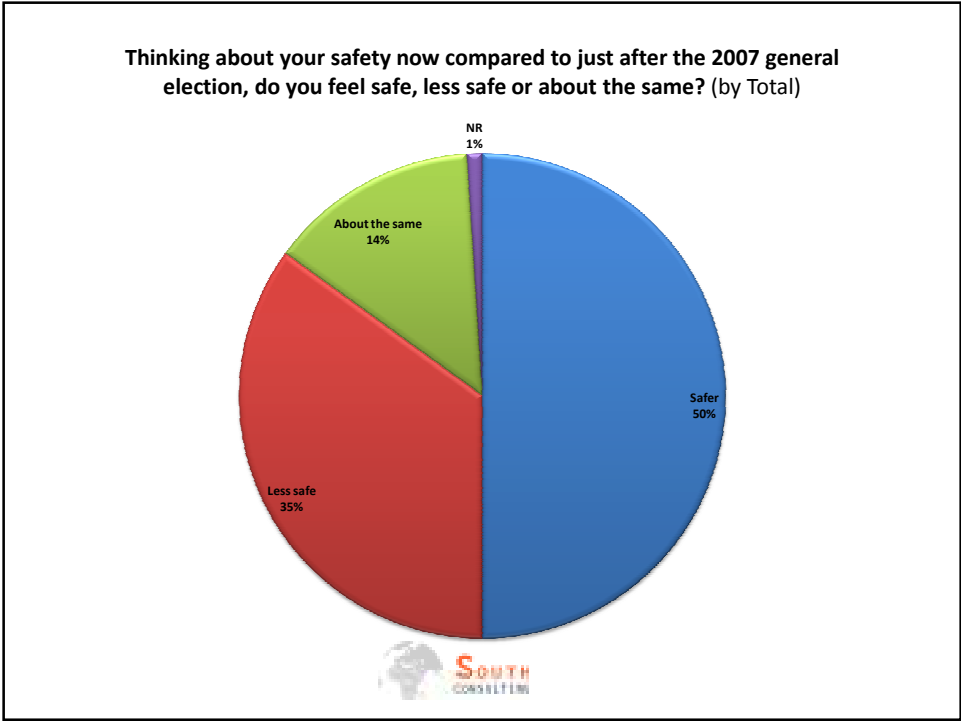
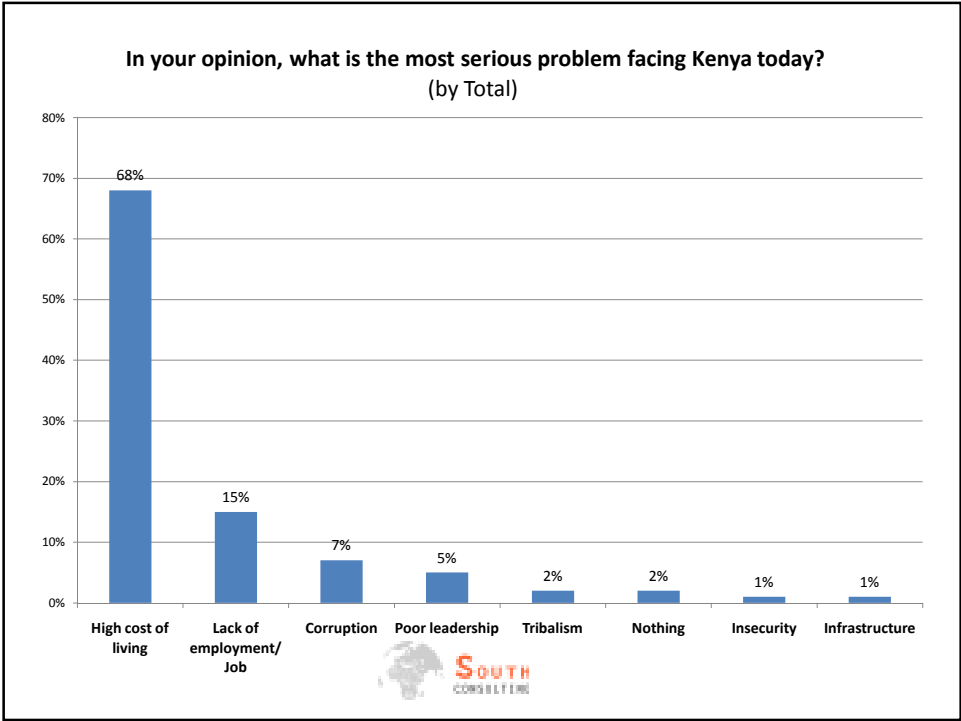

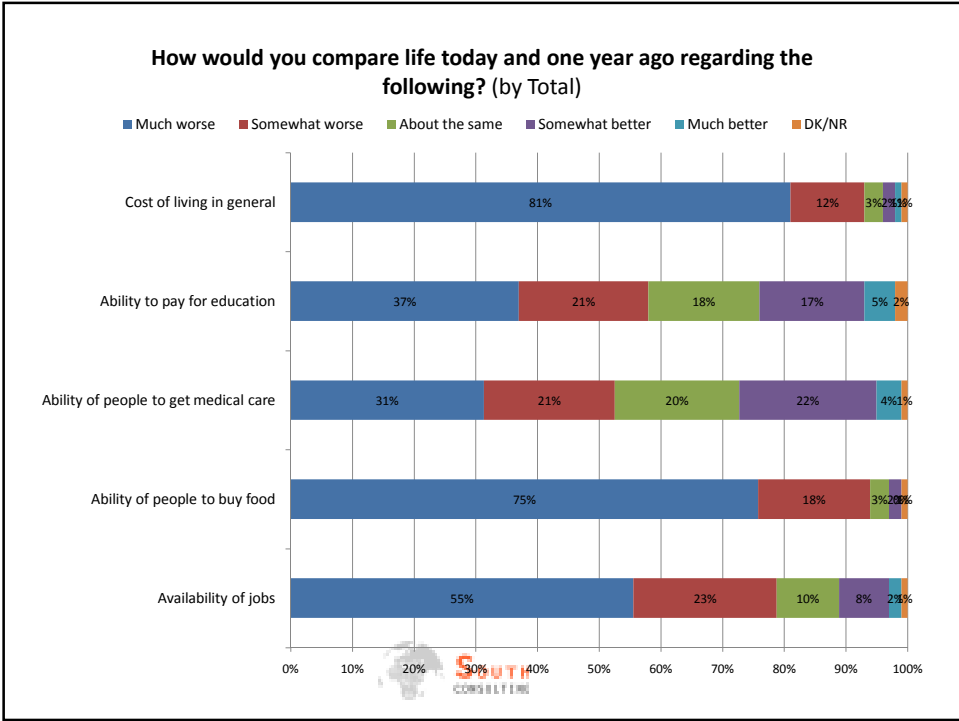


National Baseline Survey: Methodology

- Random selection of households and respondents



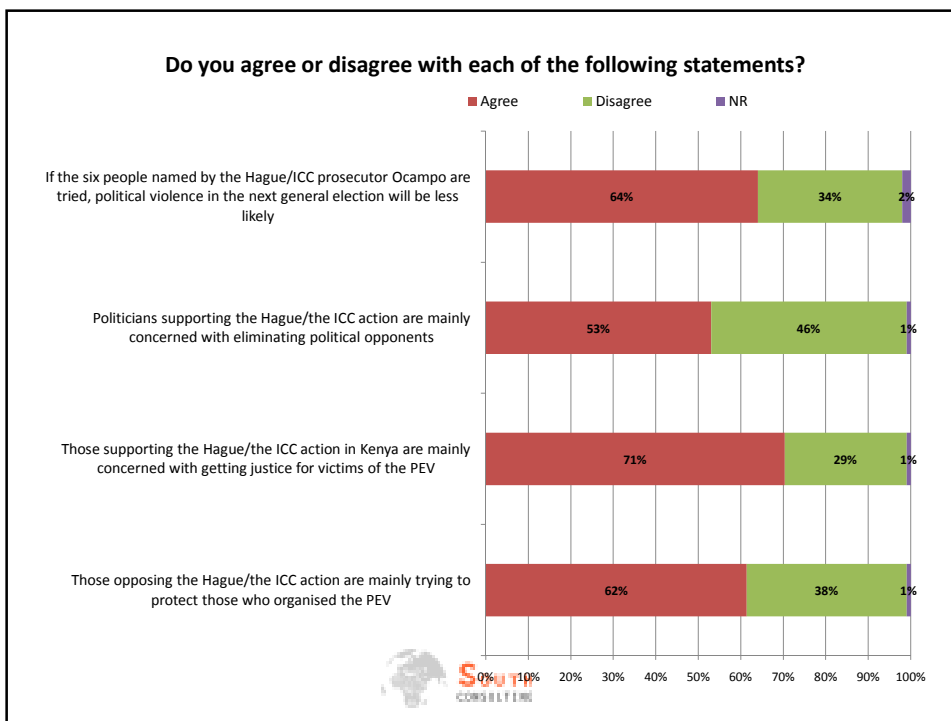
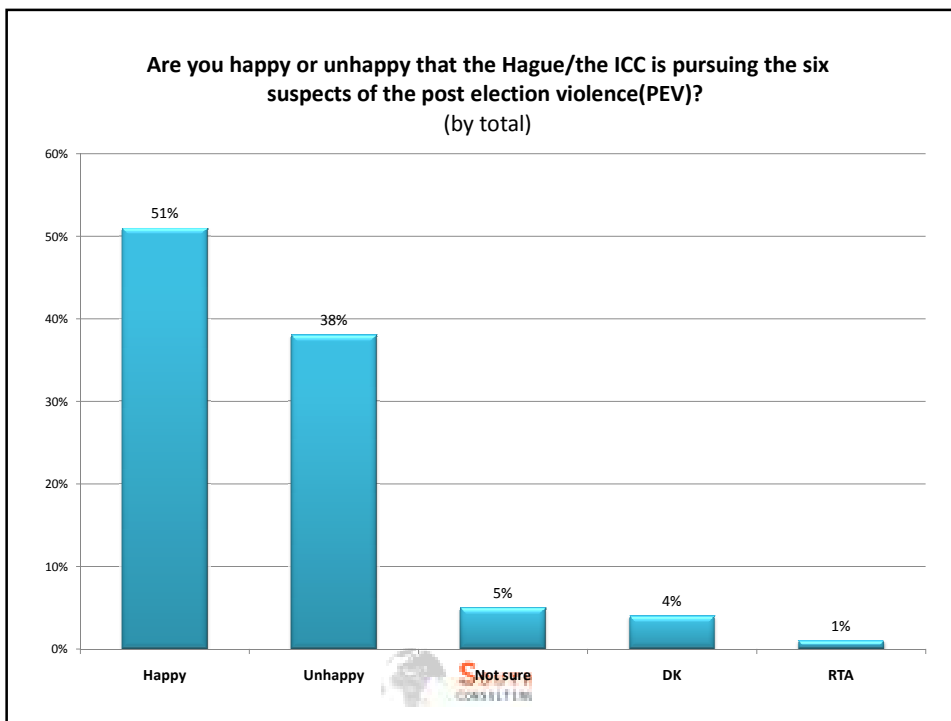


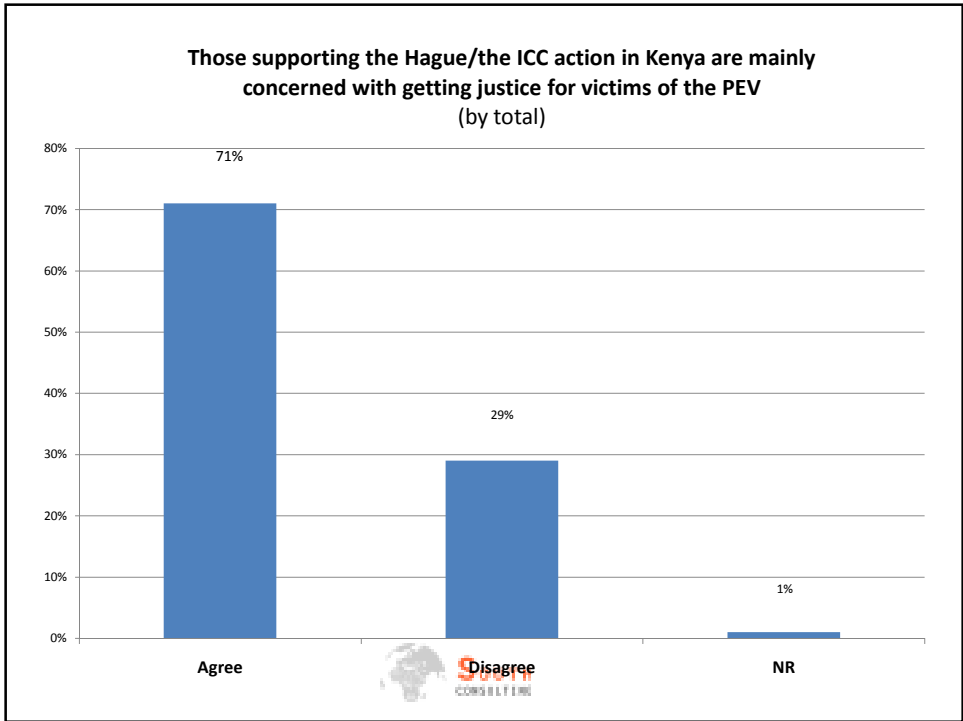
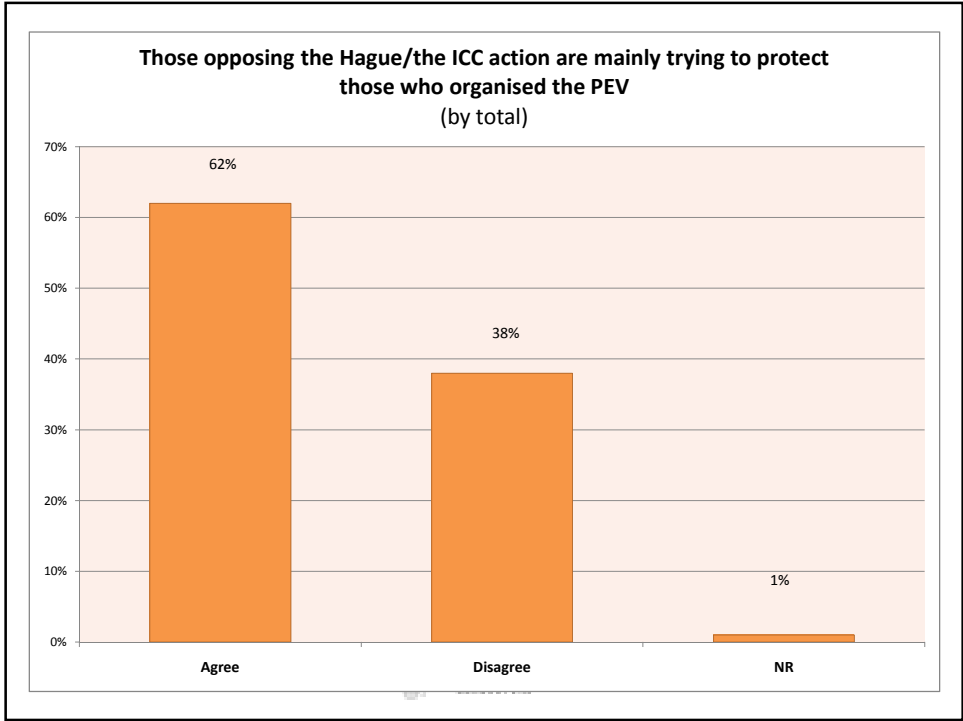


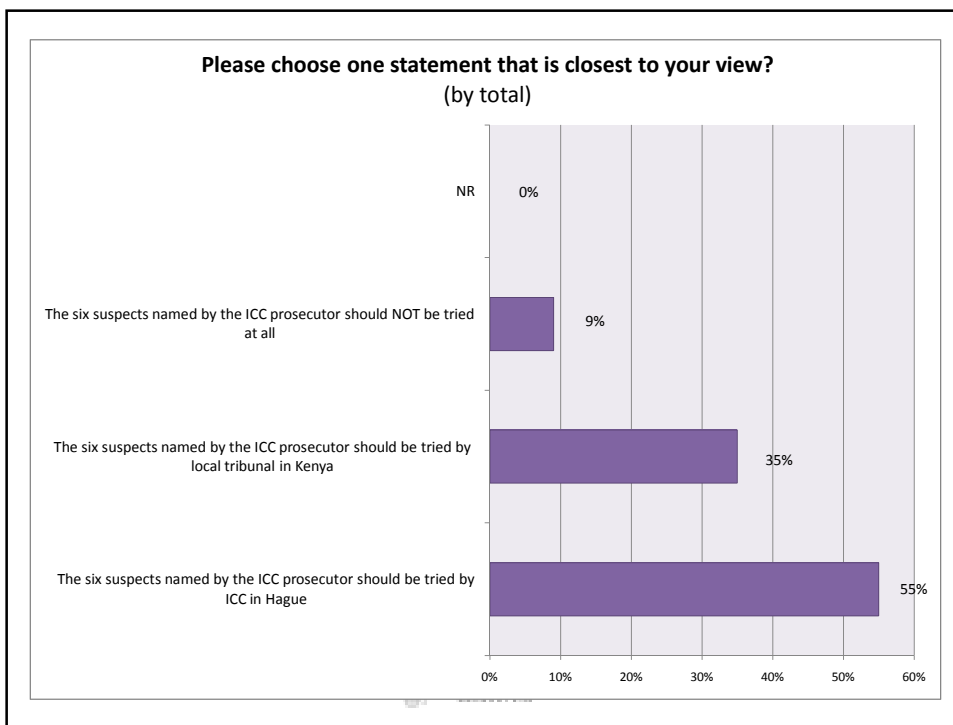
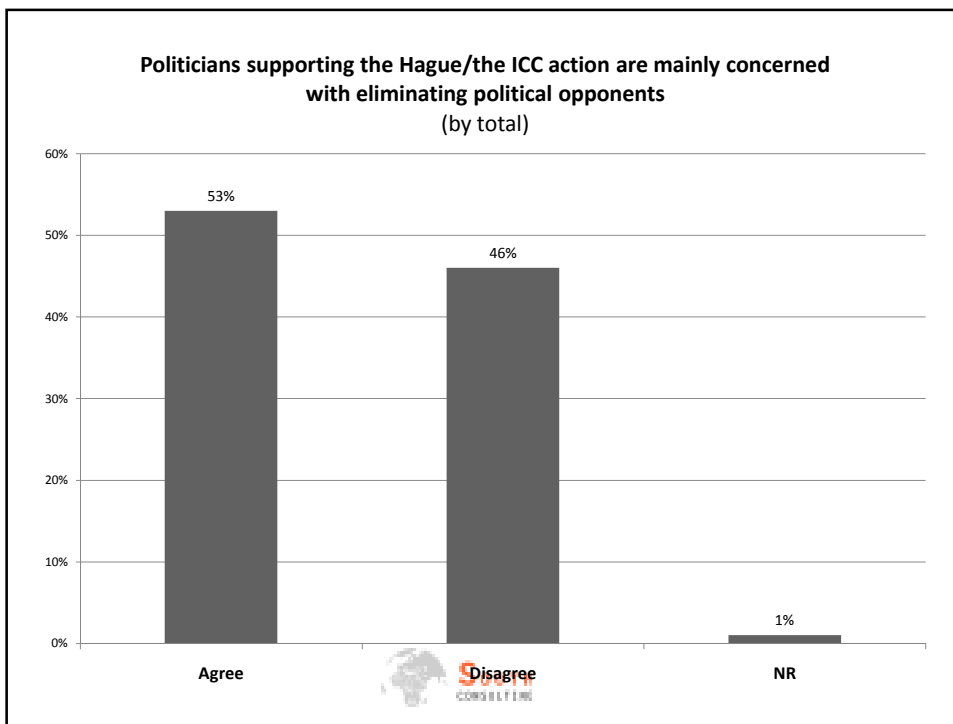

Which of the following do you consider to be the home of IDPs in Kenya? (by total)



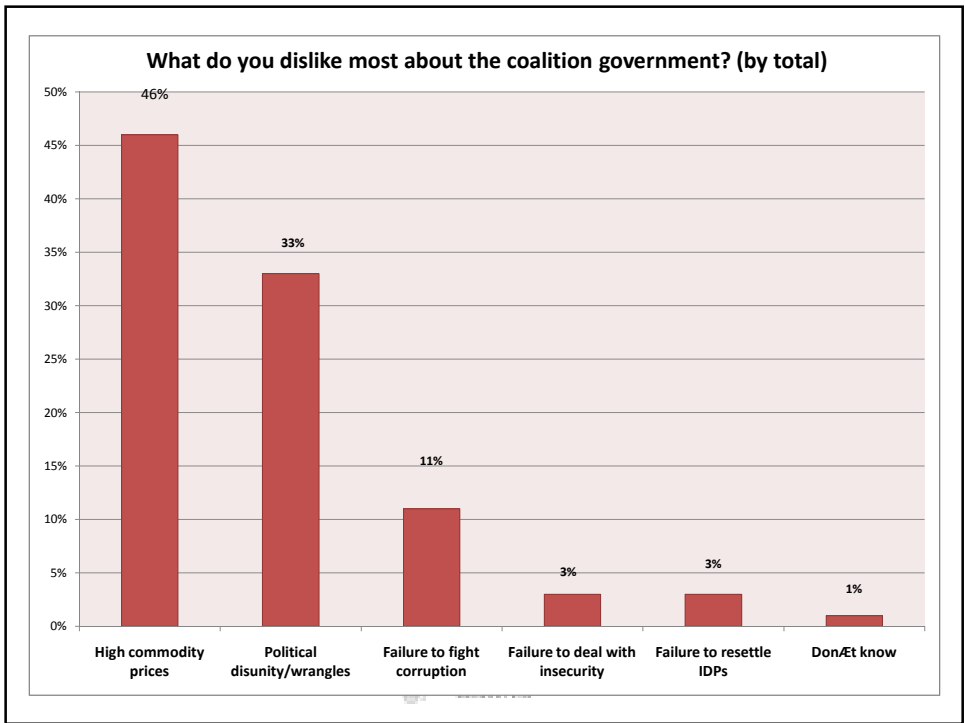
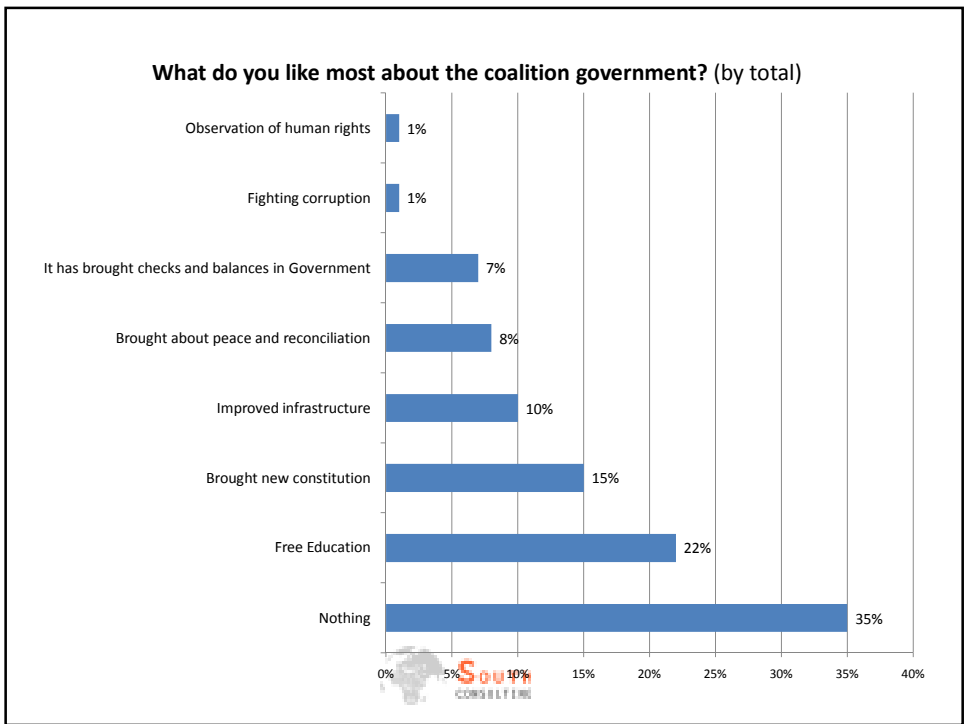


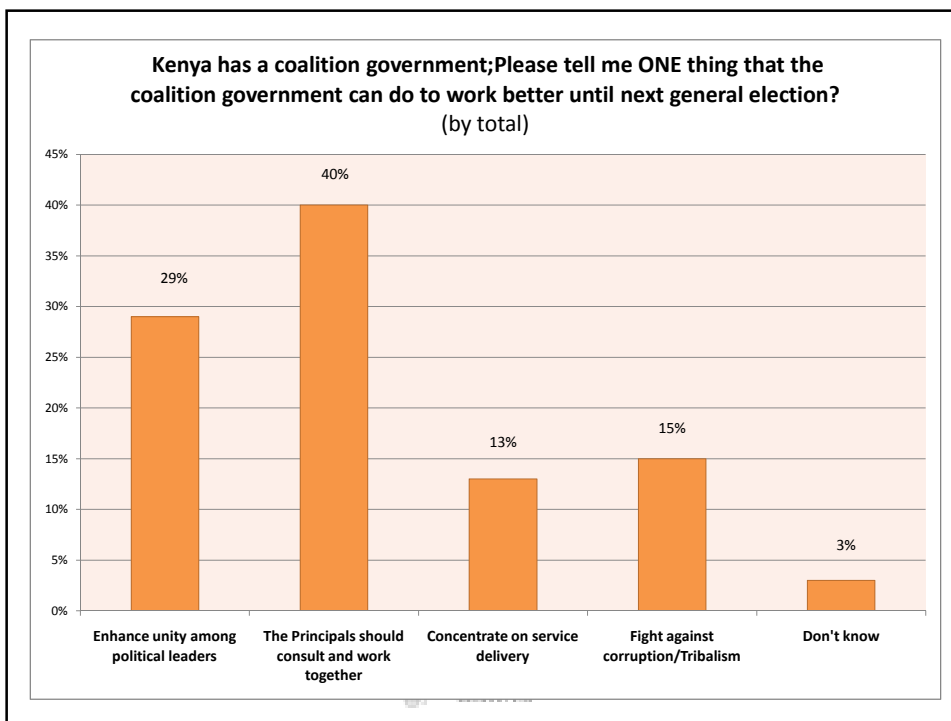
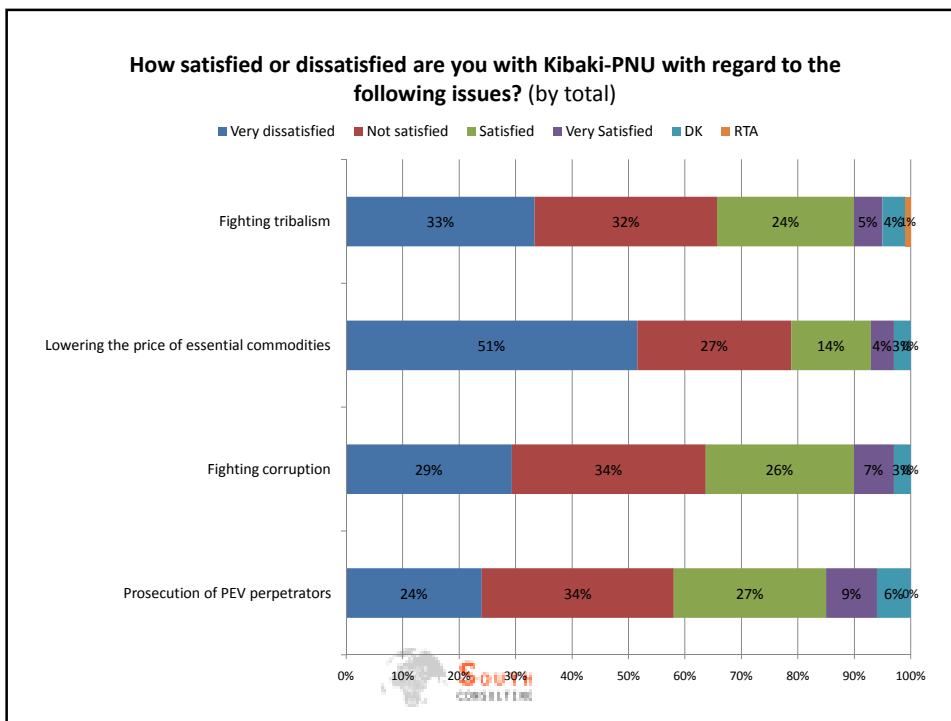


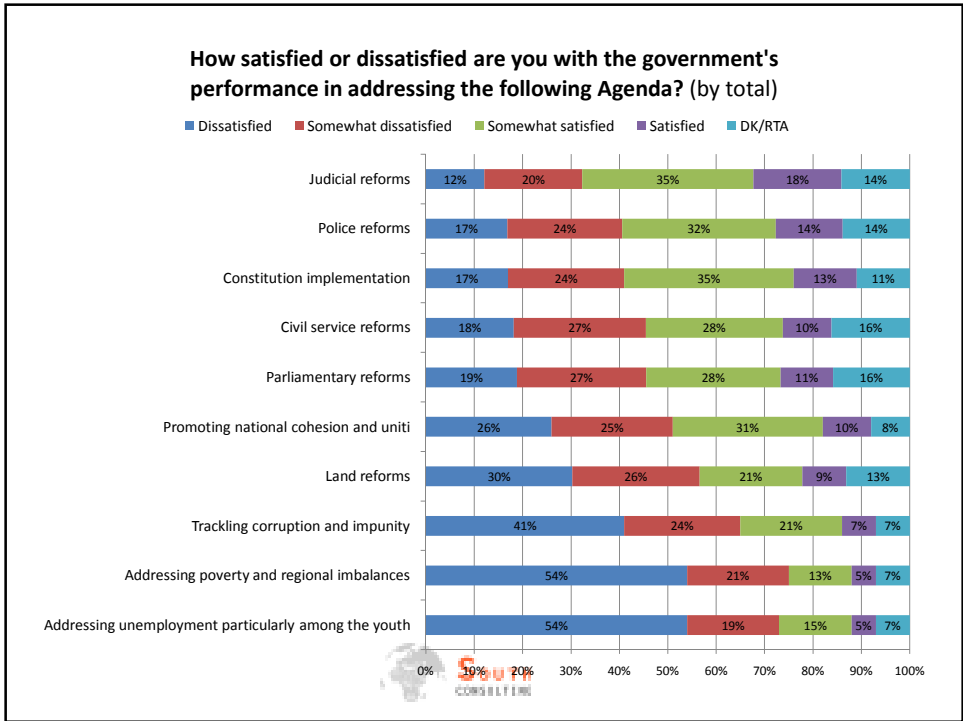
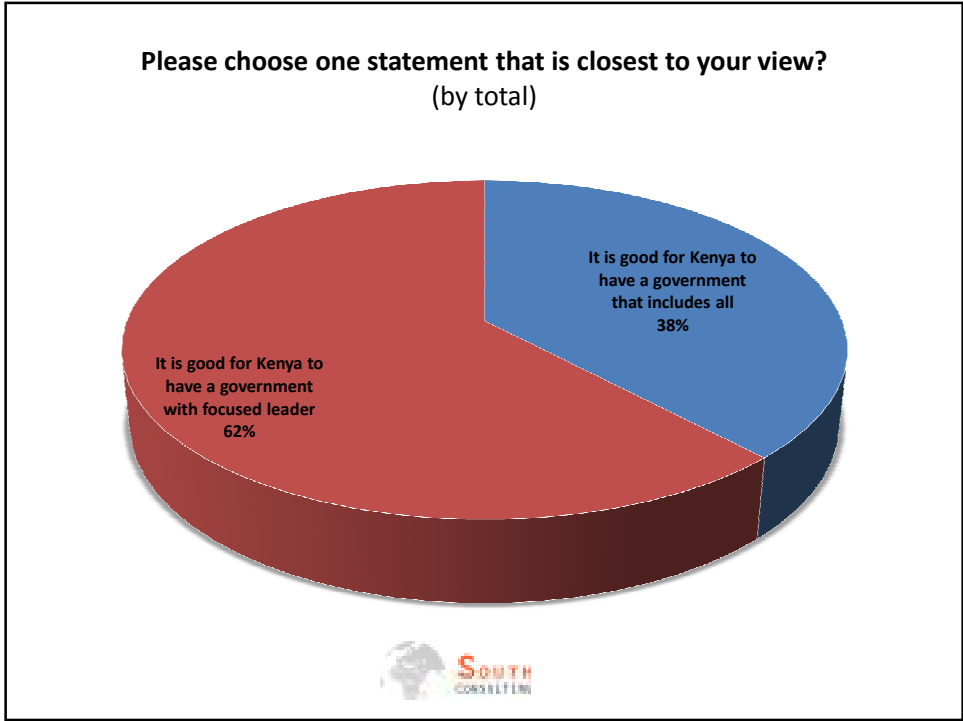
