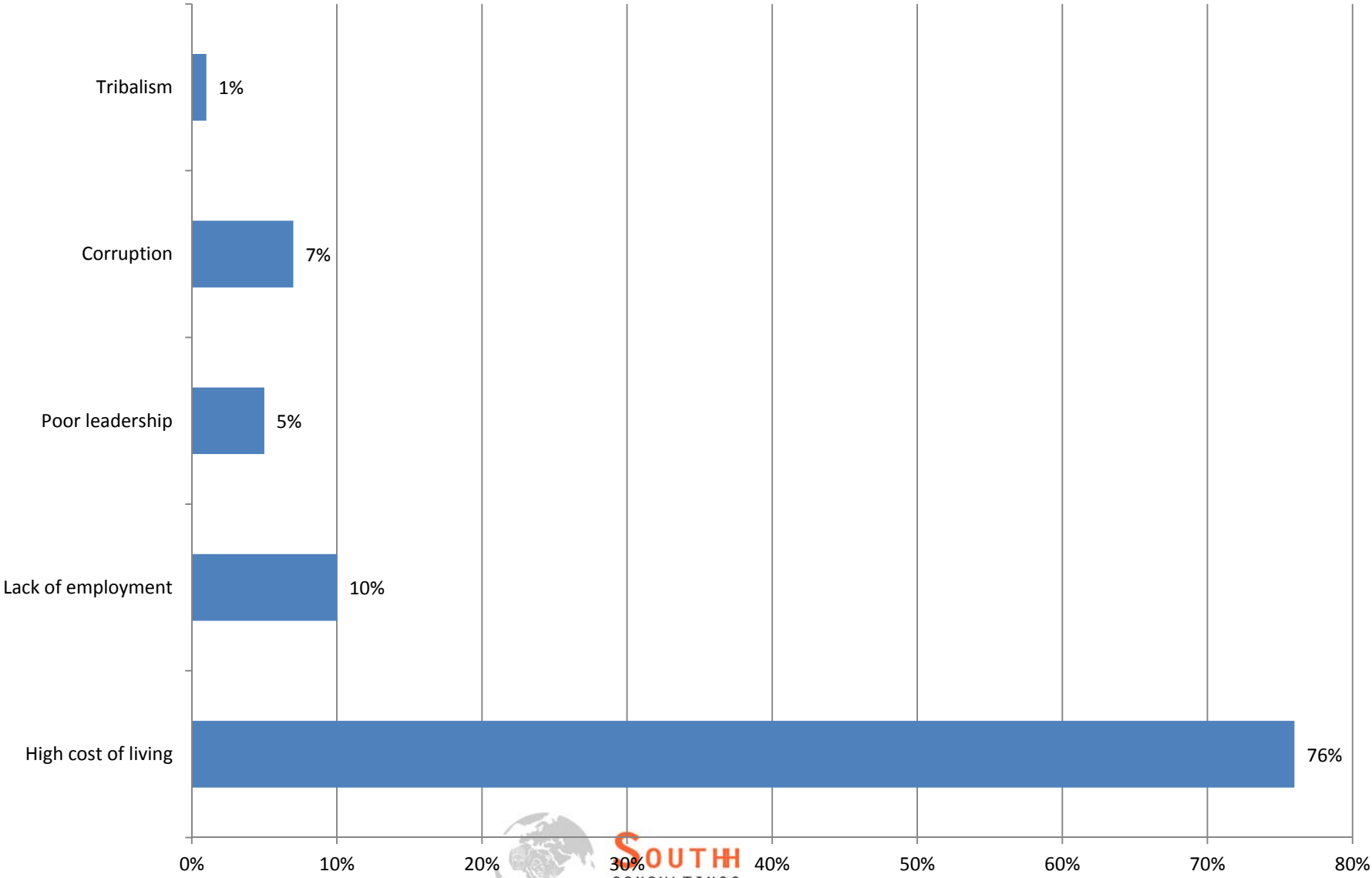

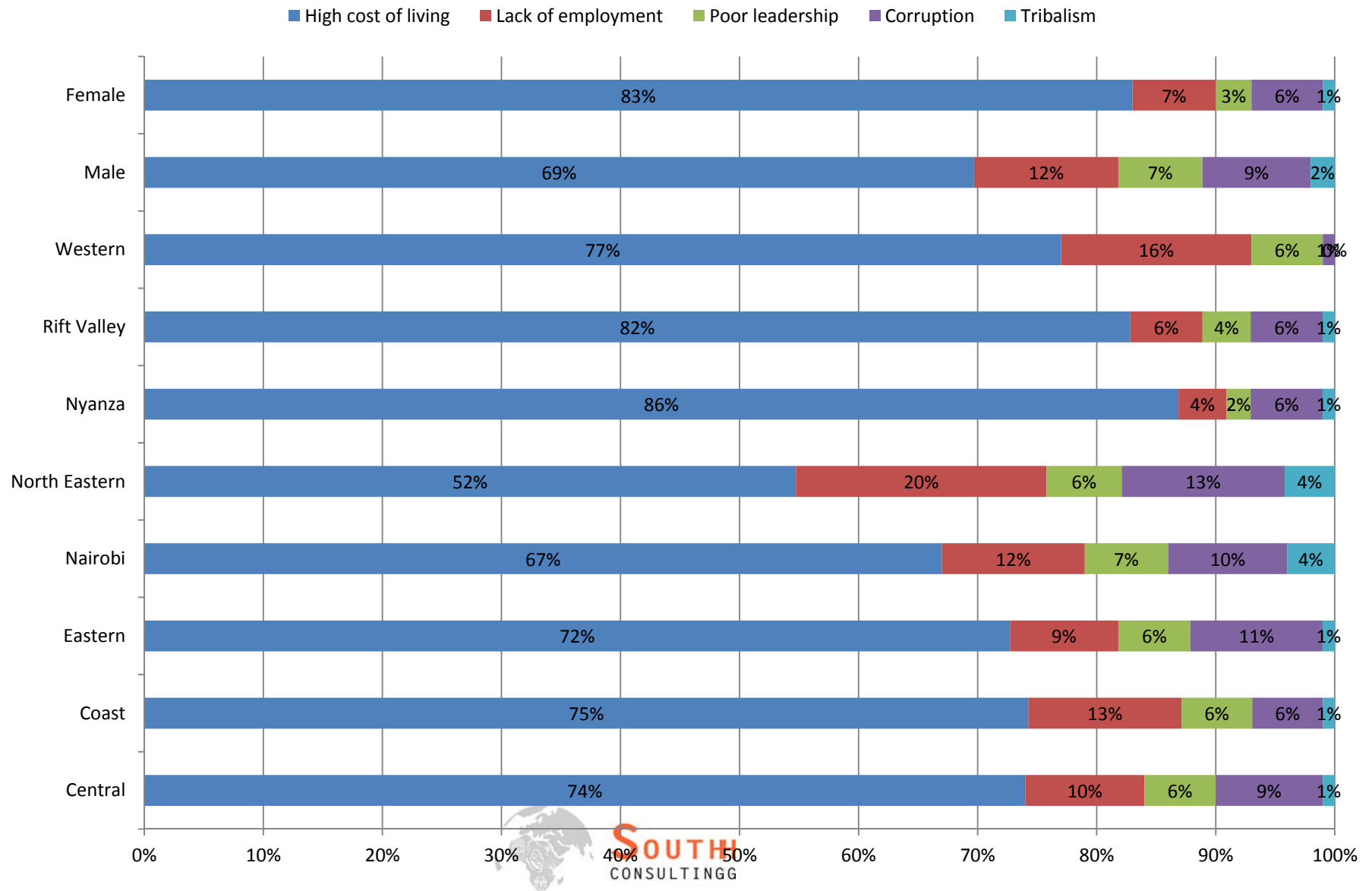
National Survey: Methodology

- Random selection of households and respondents

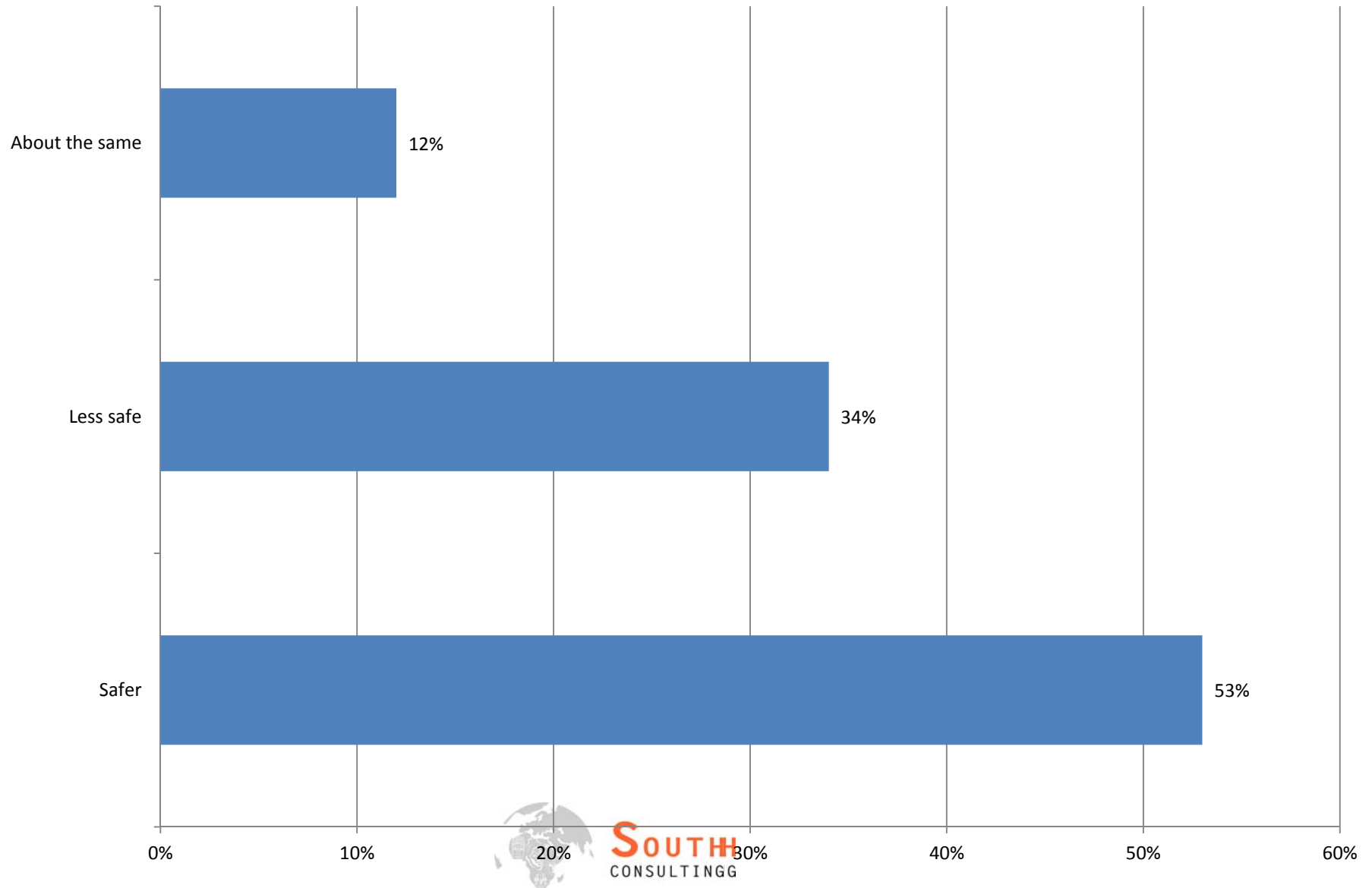
In your opinion, what is the most serious problem facing Kenya today? (by Total)



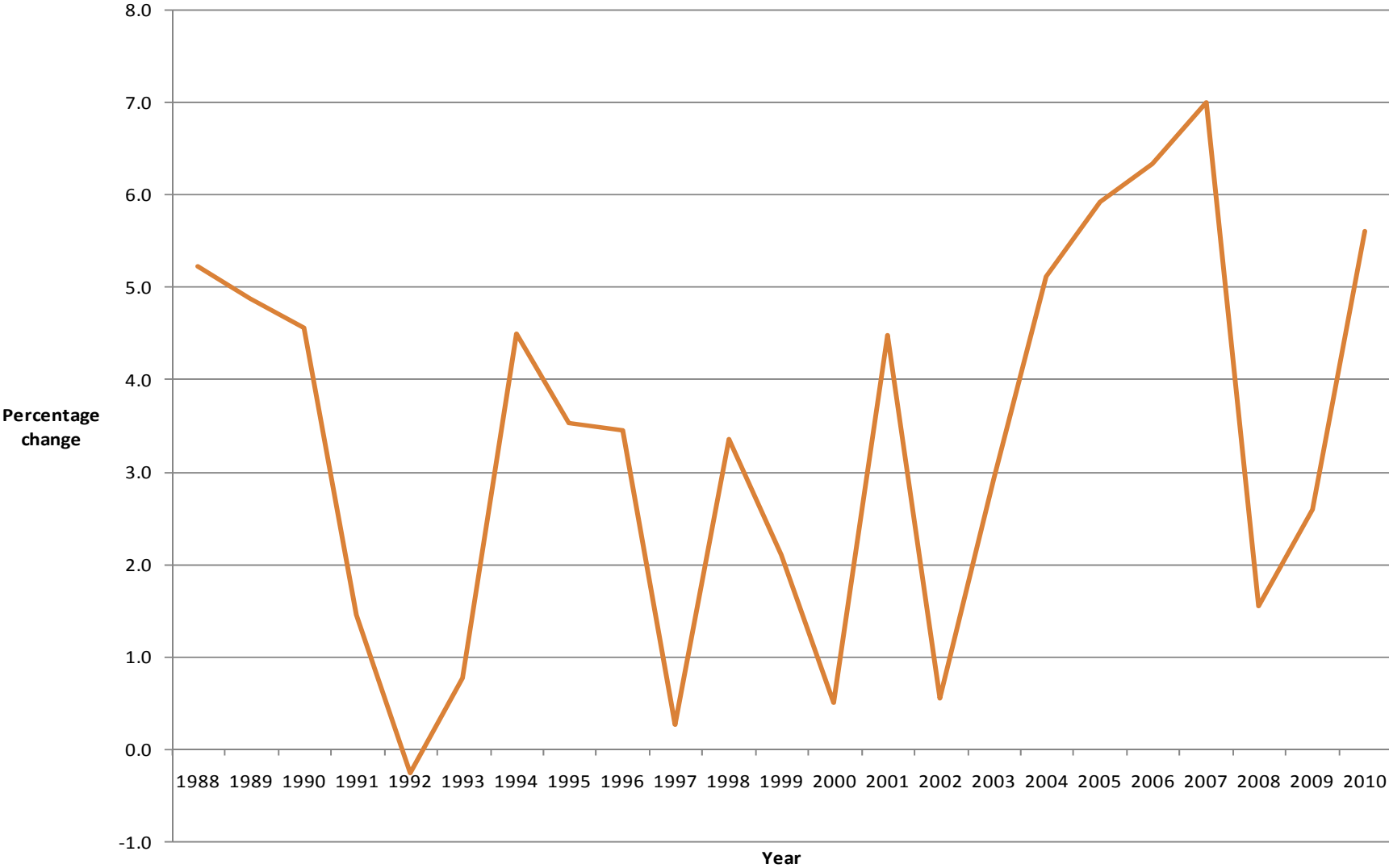
In your opinion, what is the most serious problem facing Kenya today? (by Region)

(GDP growth rate %)

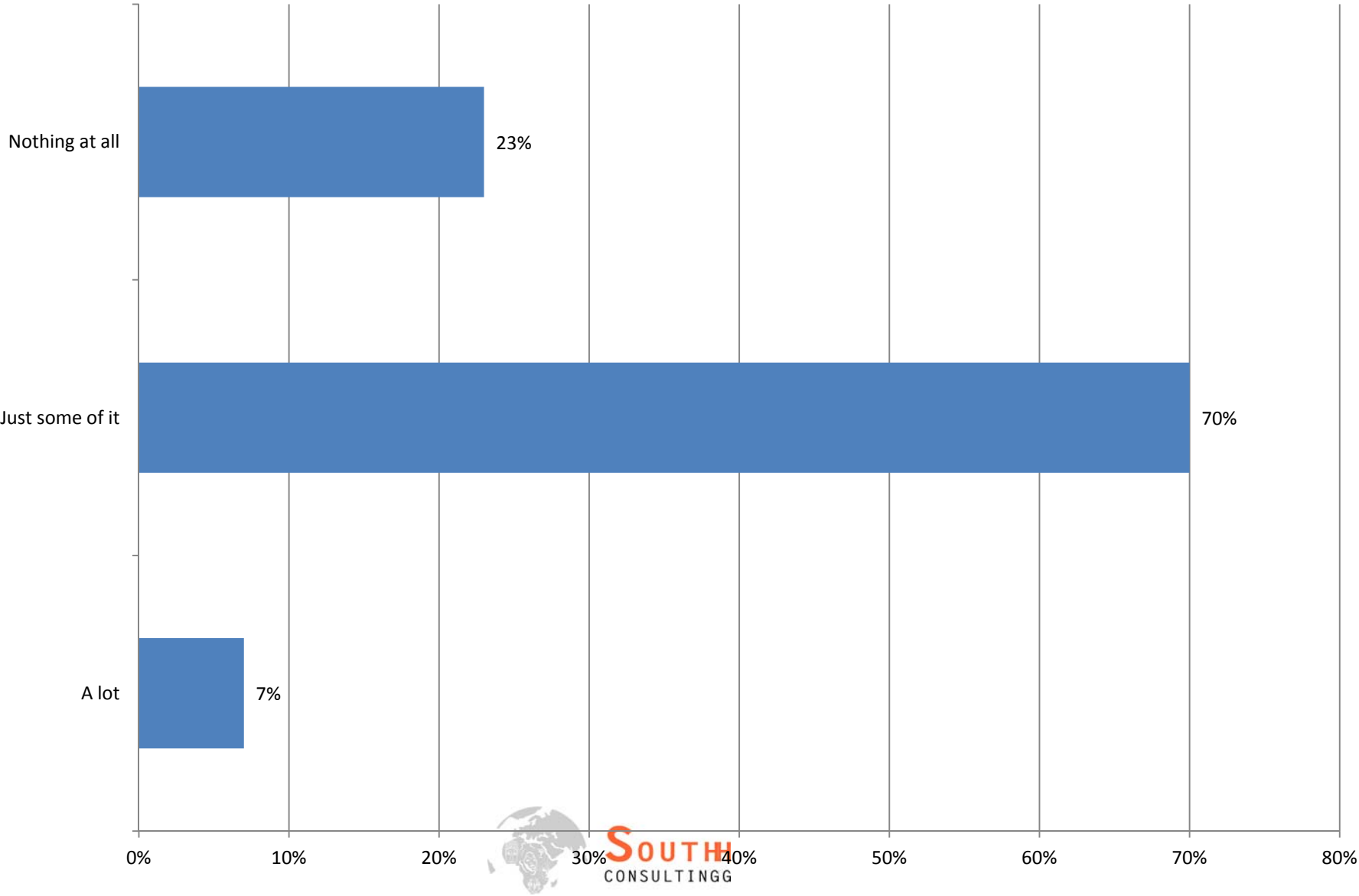

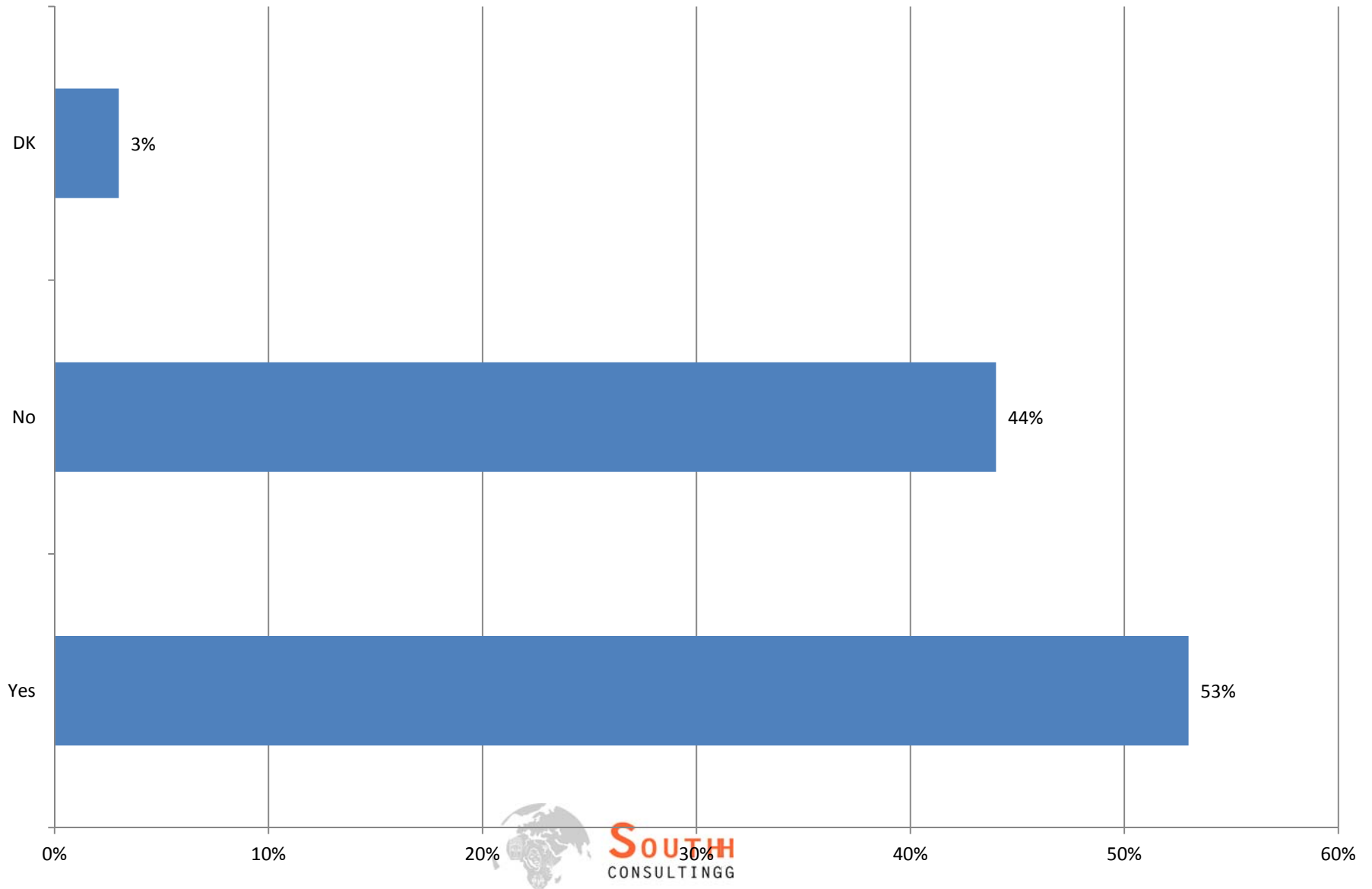

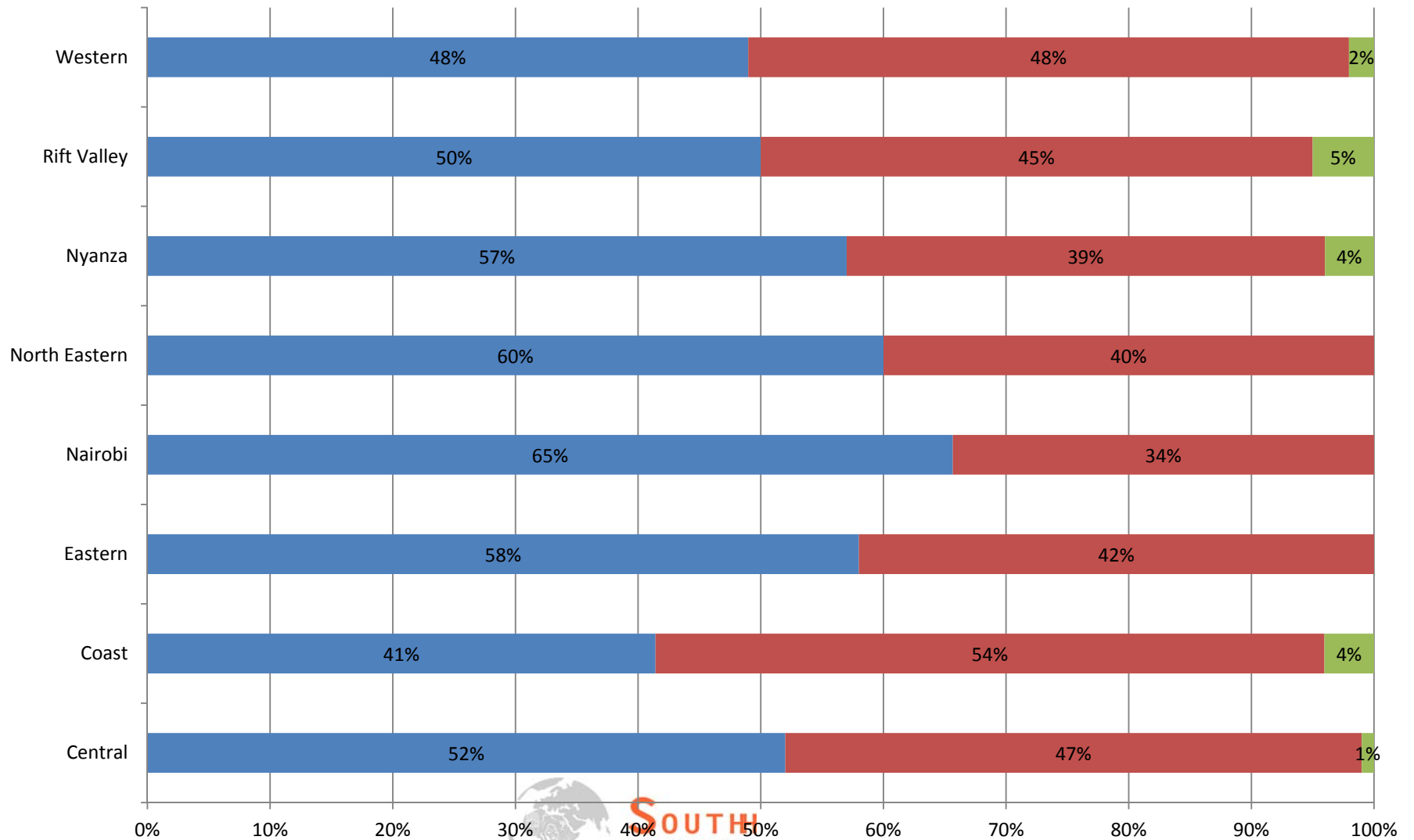


Have you observed any change in the country since adoption of the new Constitution? (by Total)

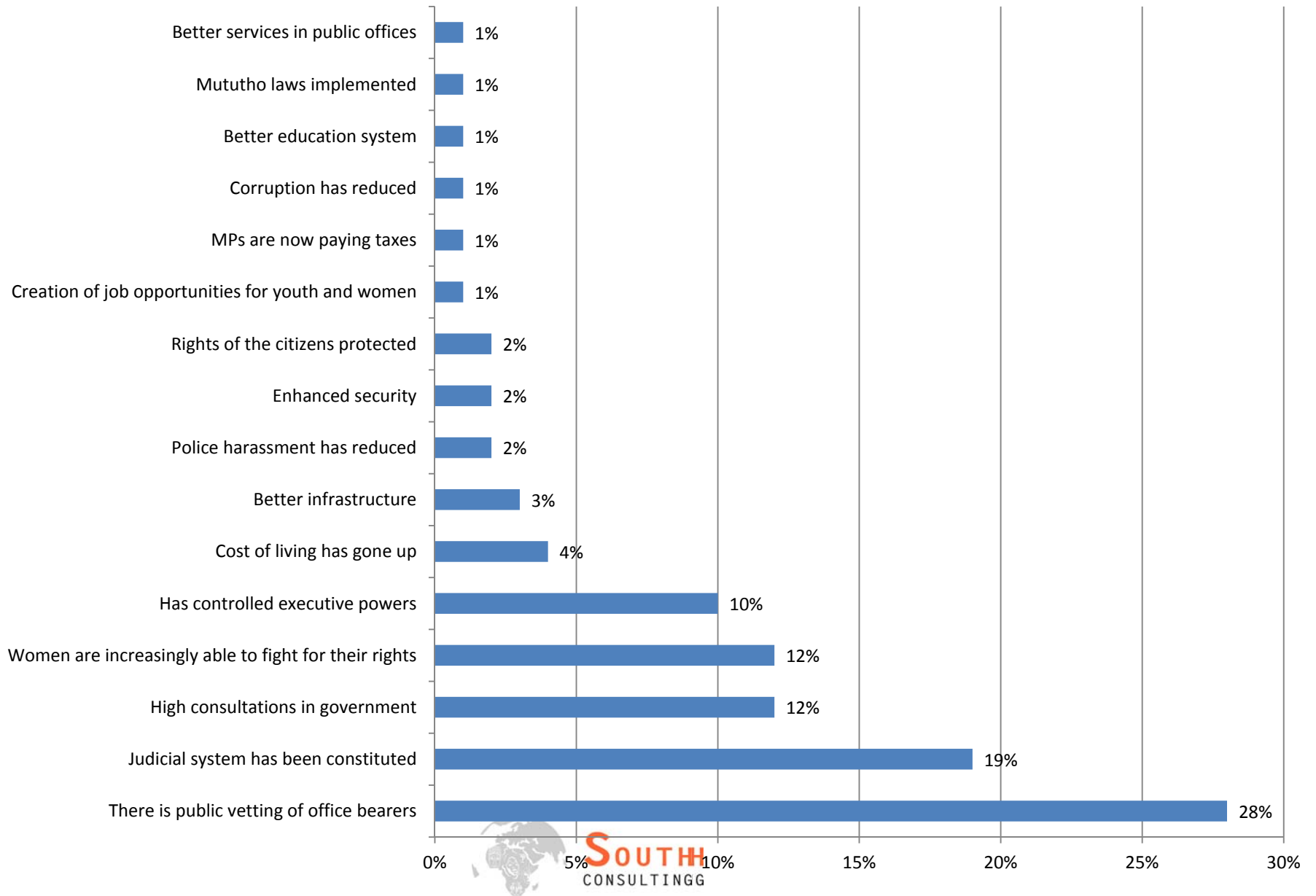

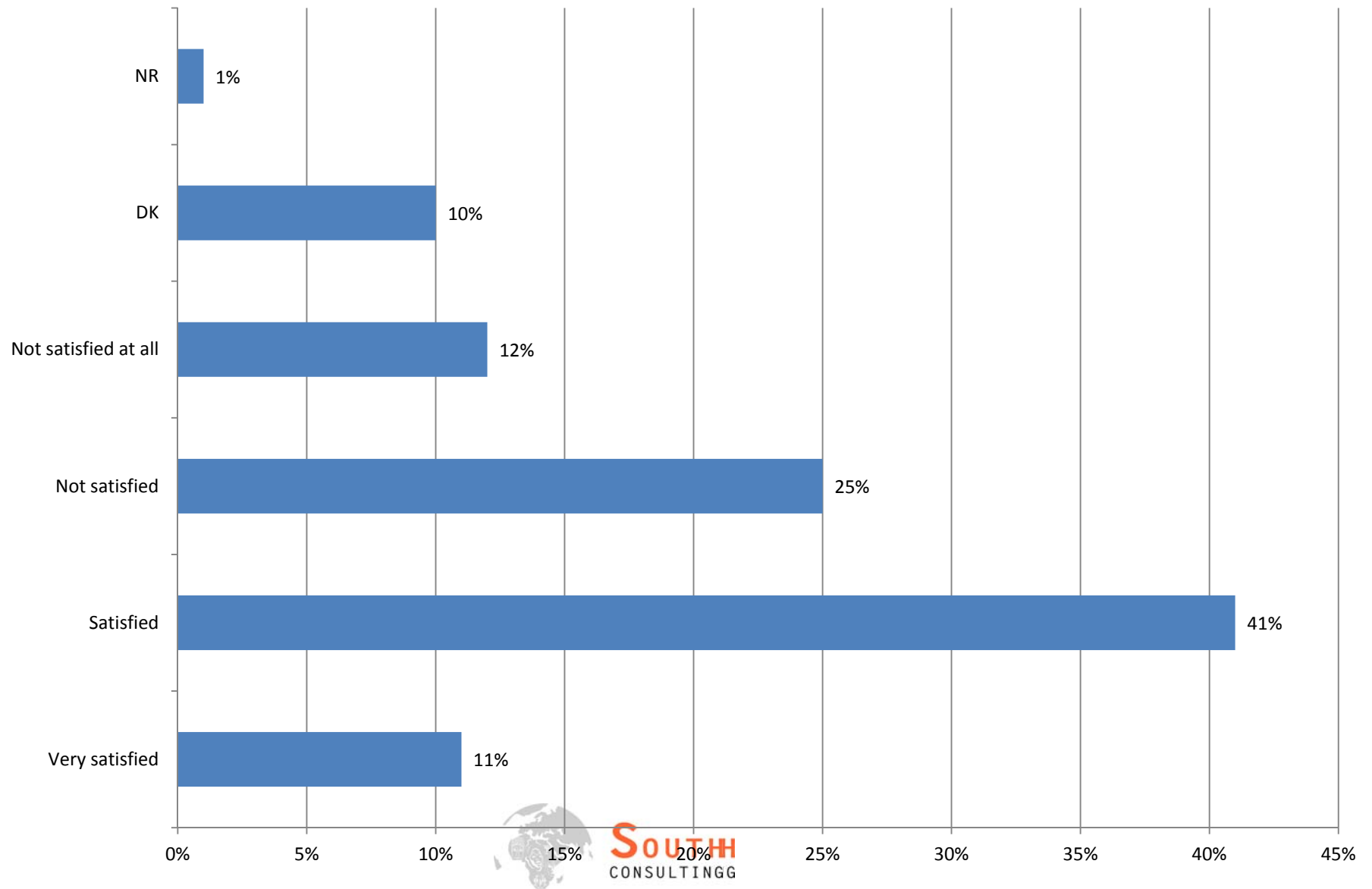

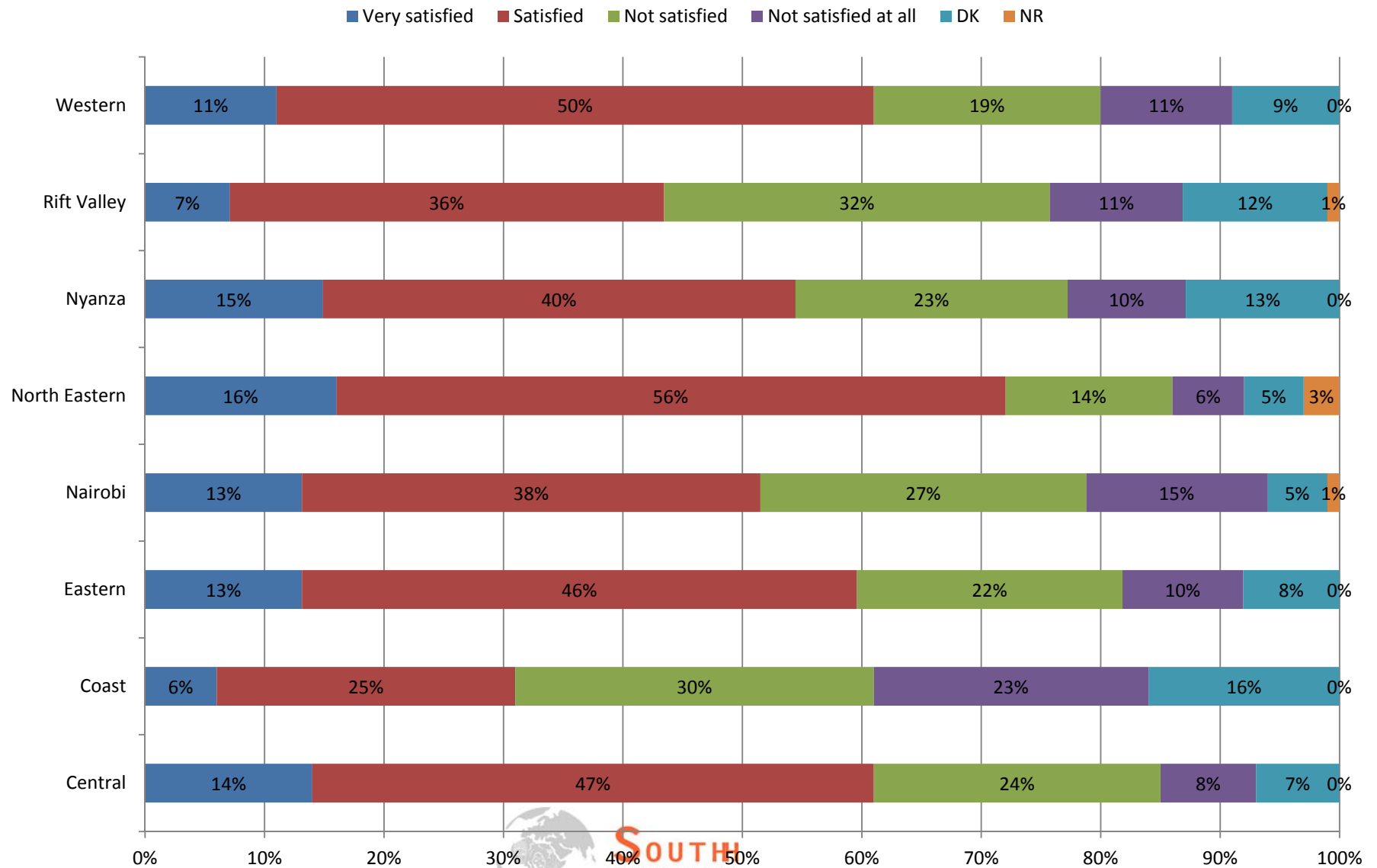
If YES what is the change? (by Total)



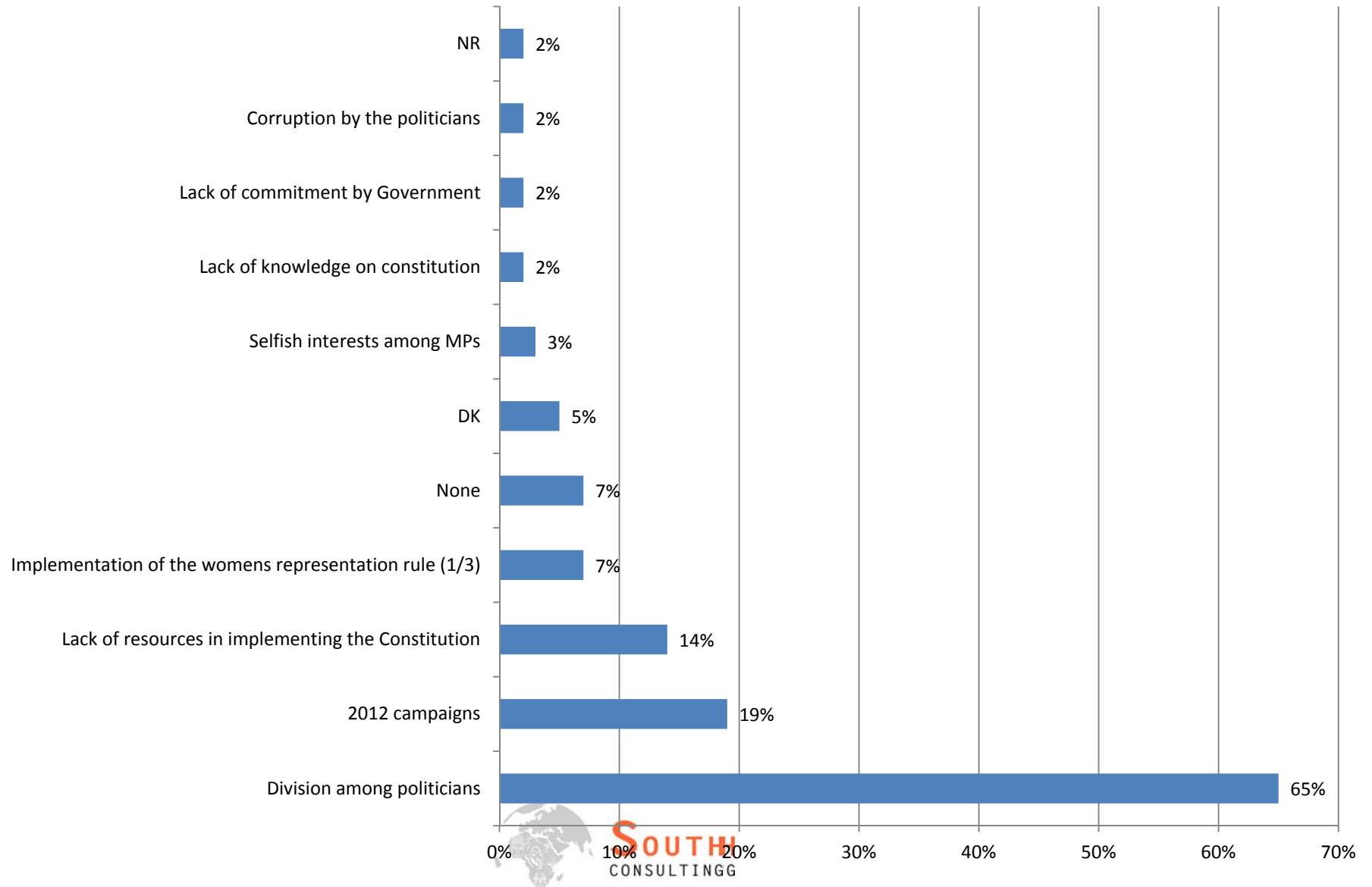
How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with progress of implementation of the new constitution? (by Total)



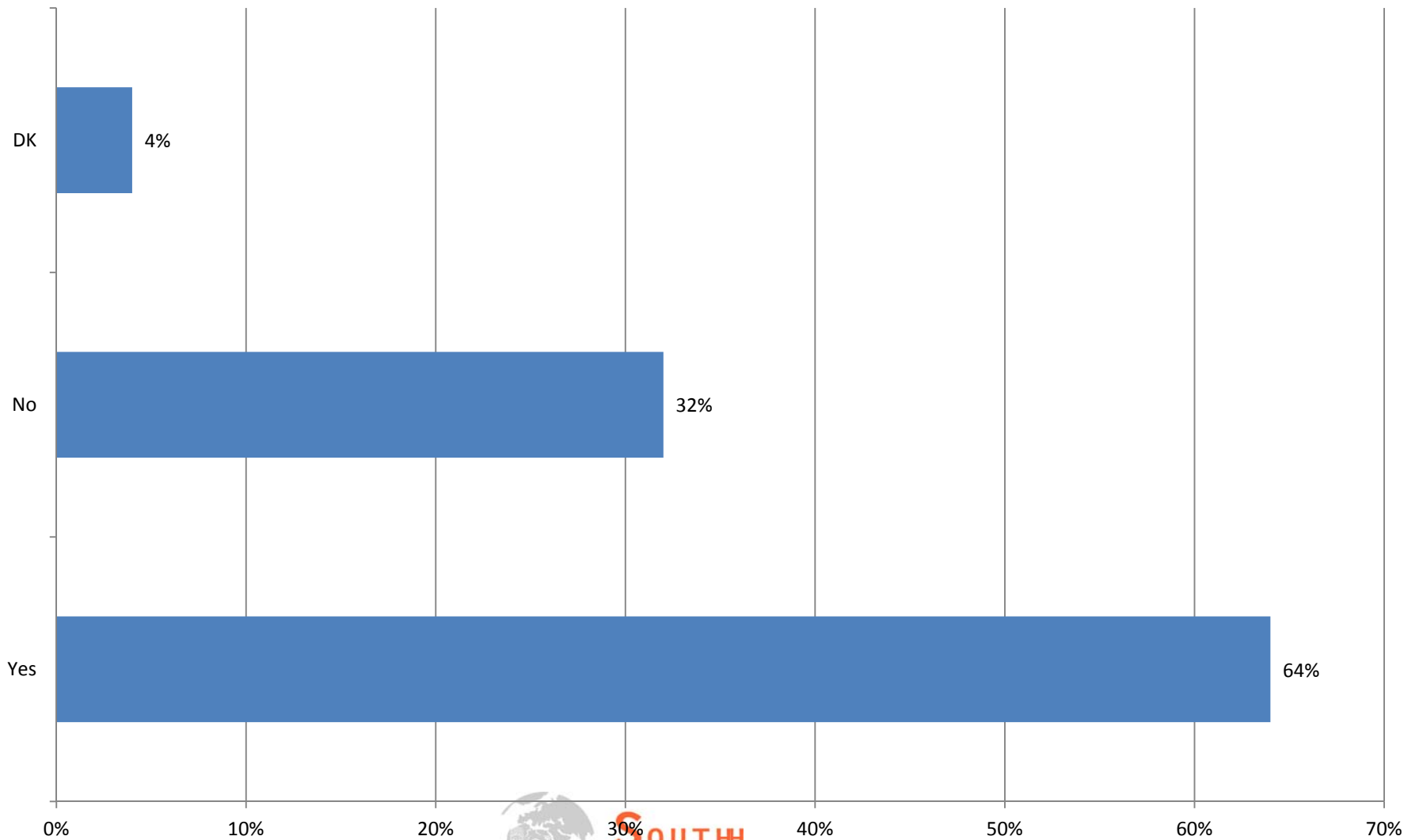
How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with progress of implementation of the new constitution? (by Region)



What difficulties, if any, do you see facing the implementation of the new constitution? (by Total)

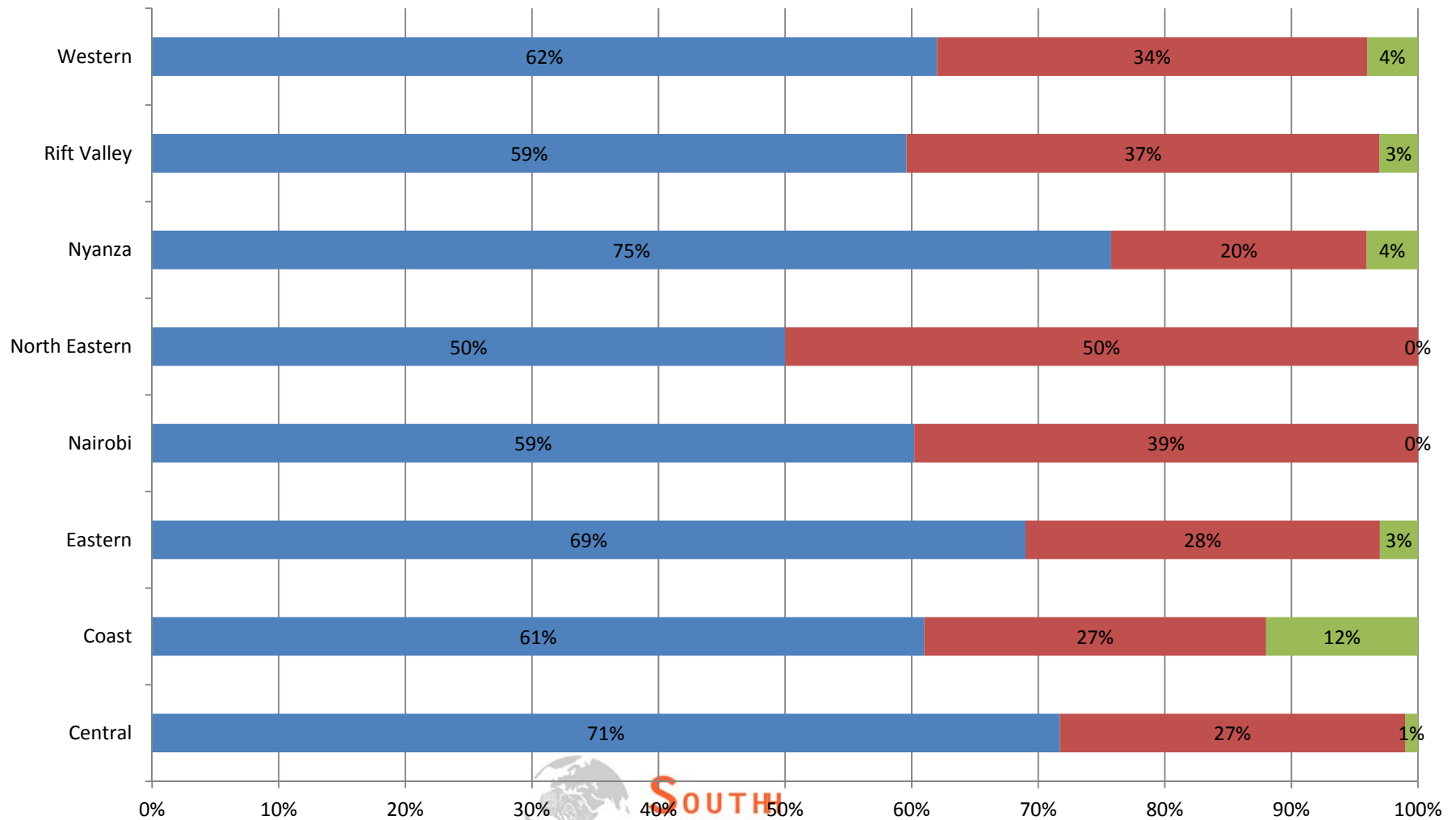


Would you support a proposal to reserve some parliamentary constituencies for women candidates ensure the next Parliament at least 1/3 women? (by Total)

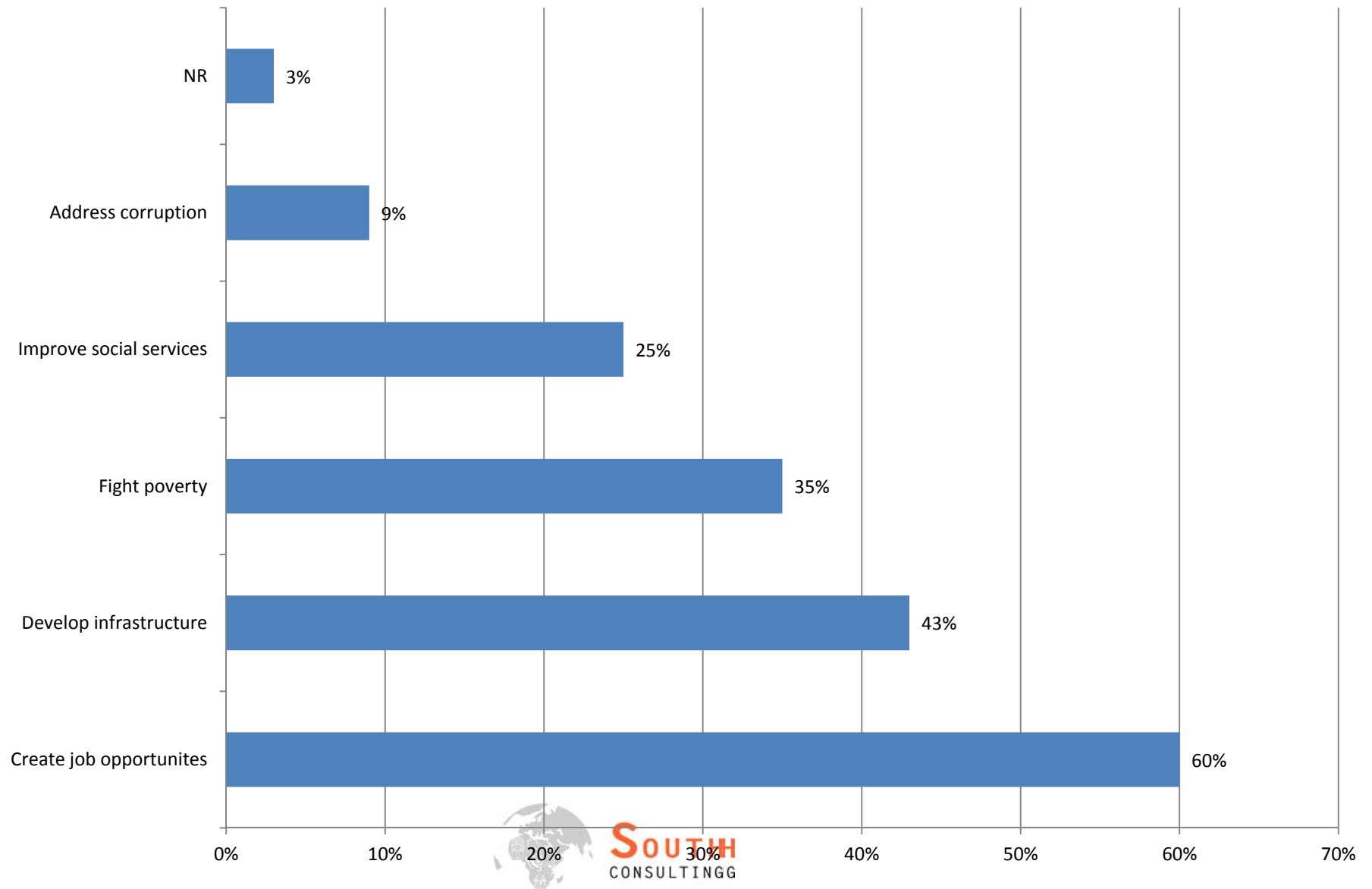

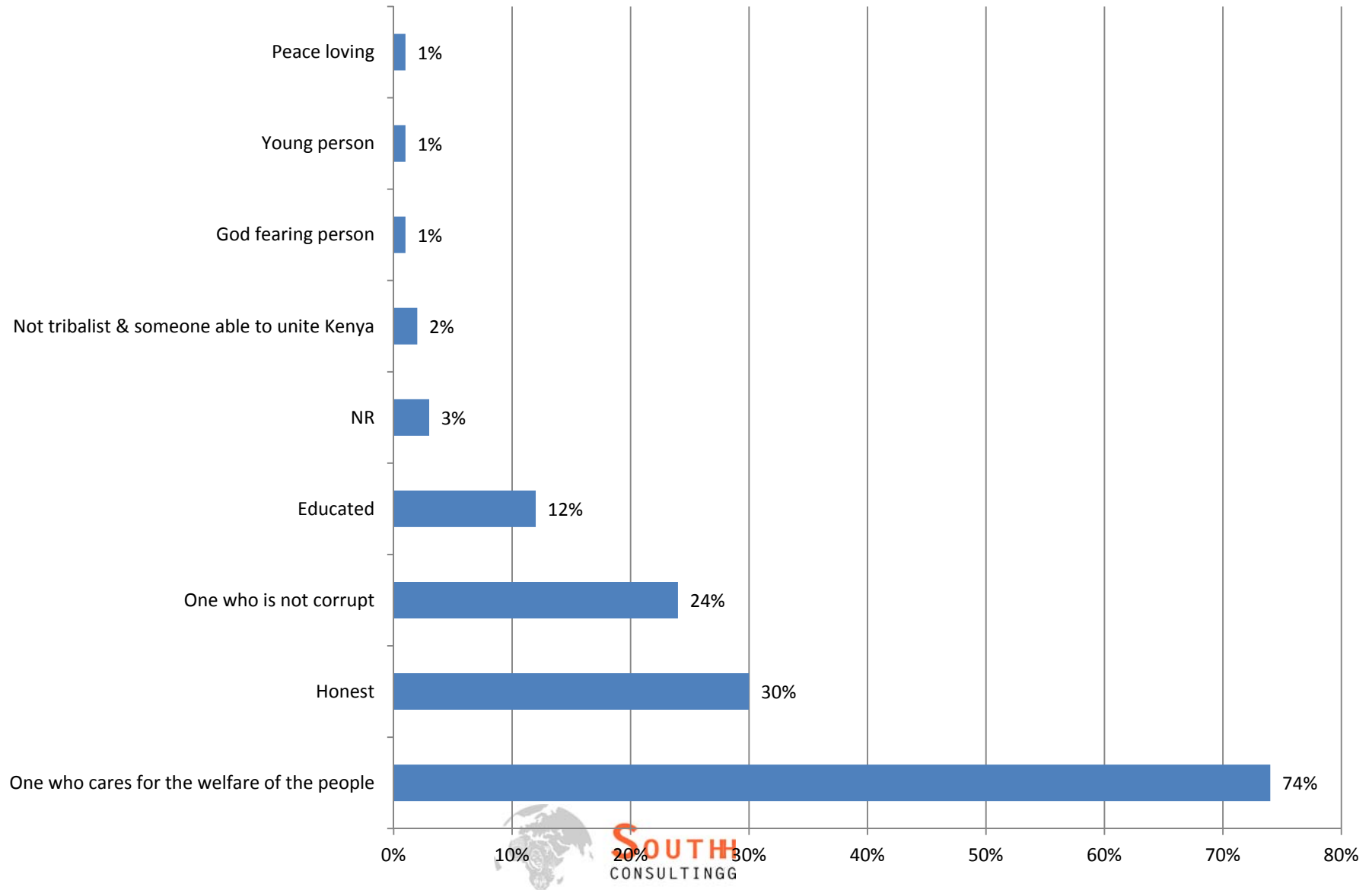

The constitution provides for County government, what 2 things would you like the County government to address as a priority? (by Total)

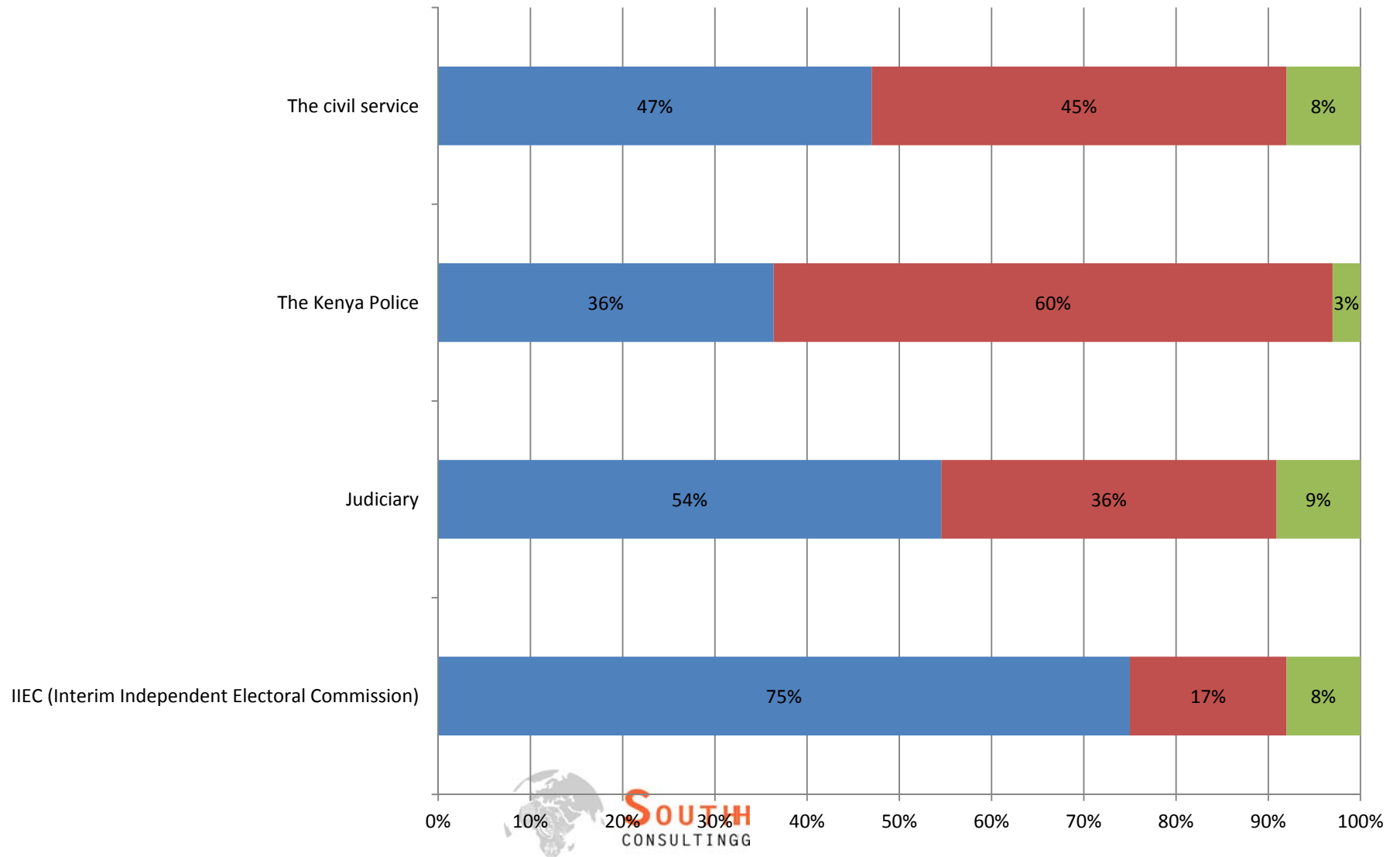


In the next general elections, what qualities of a leader will you look for in choosing leaders? (by Total)

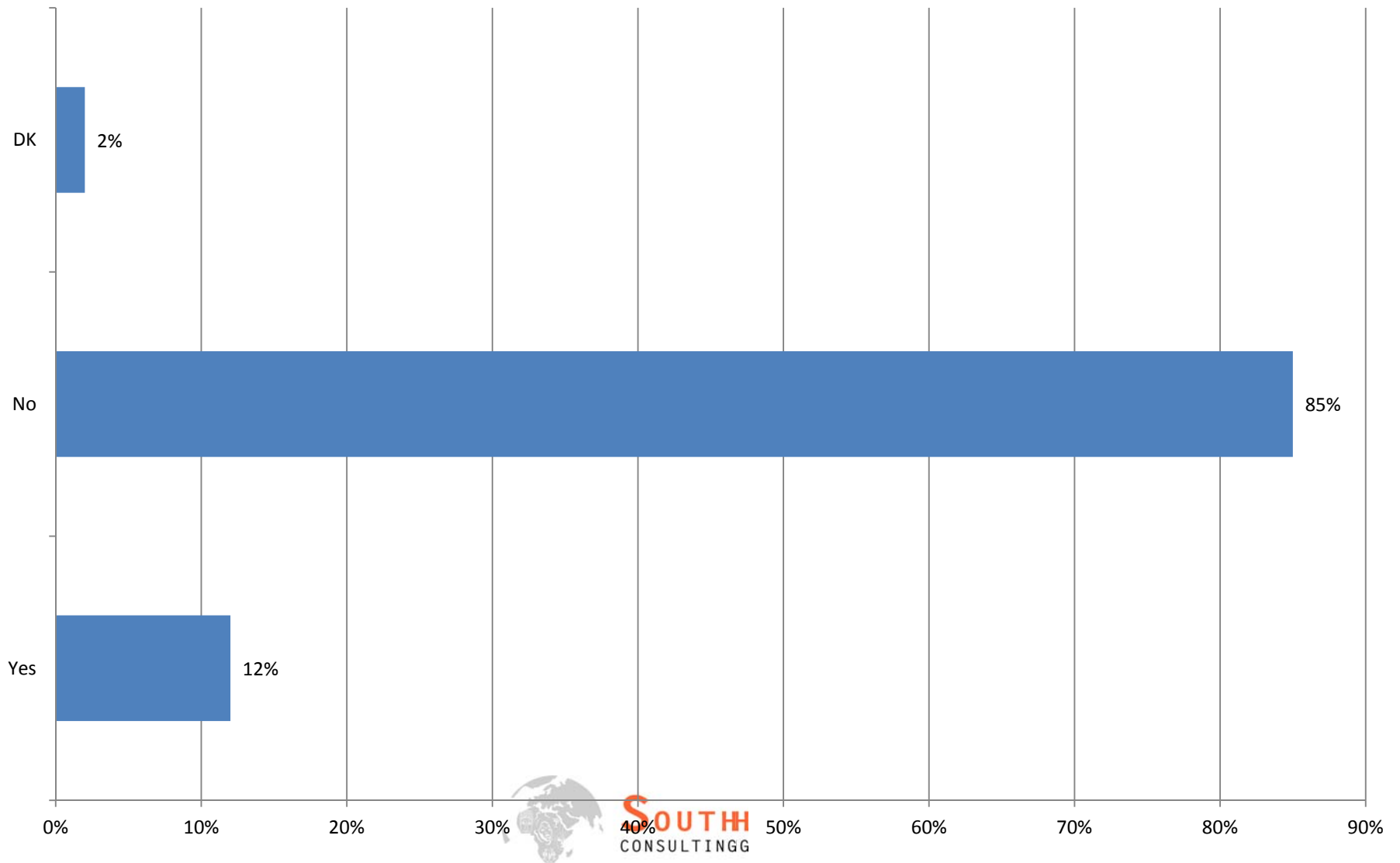


How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the performance of the following bodies?

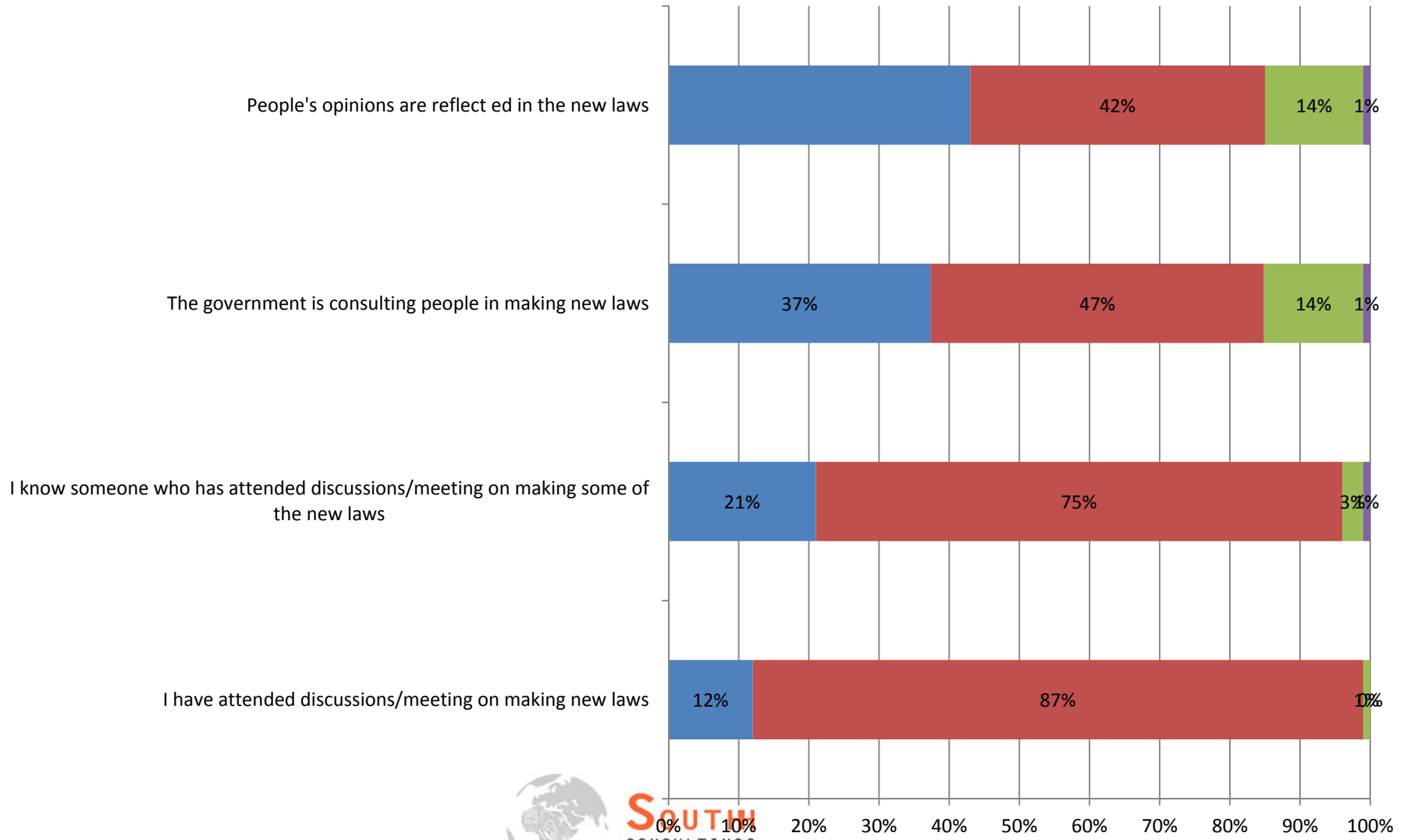


Since the adoption of a new Constitution in August 2010, have you attended any meetings where people discussed elections under the new constitution? (by Total)



How much do you agree or disagree with the following statements regarding the making of new laws under the new constitution?

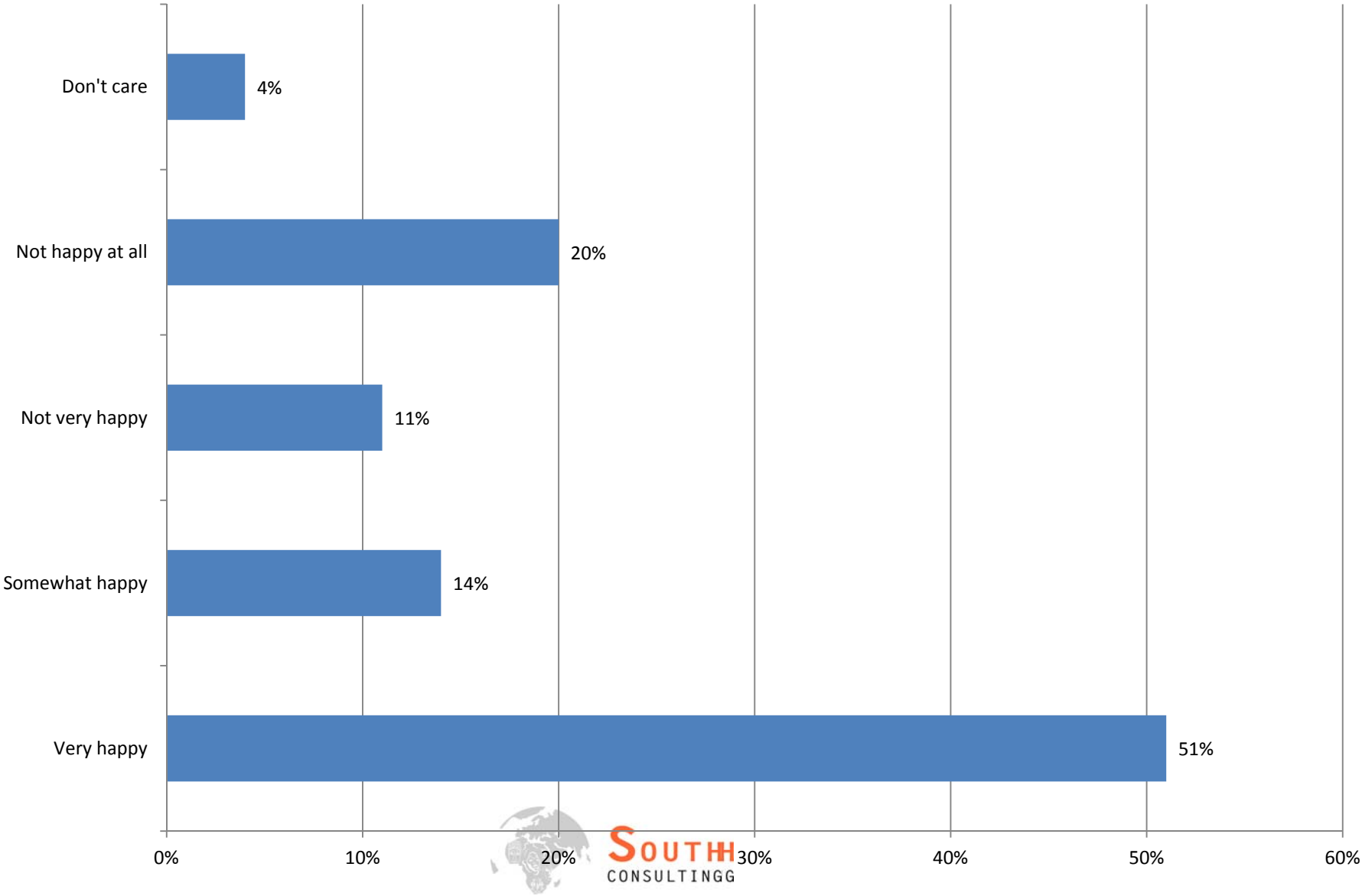

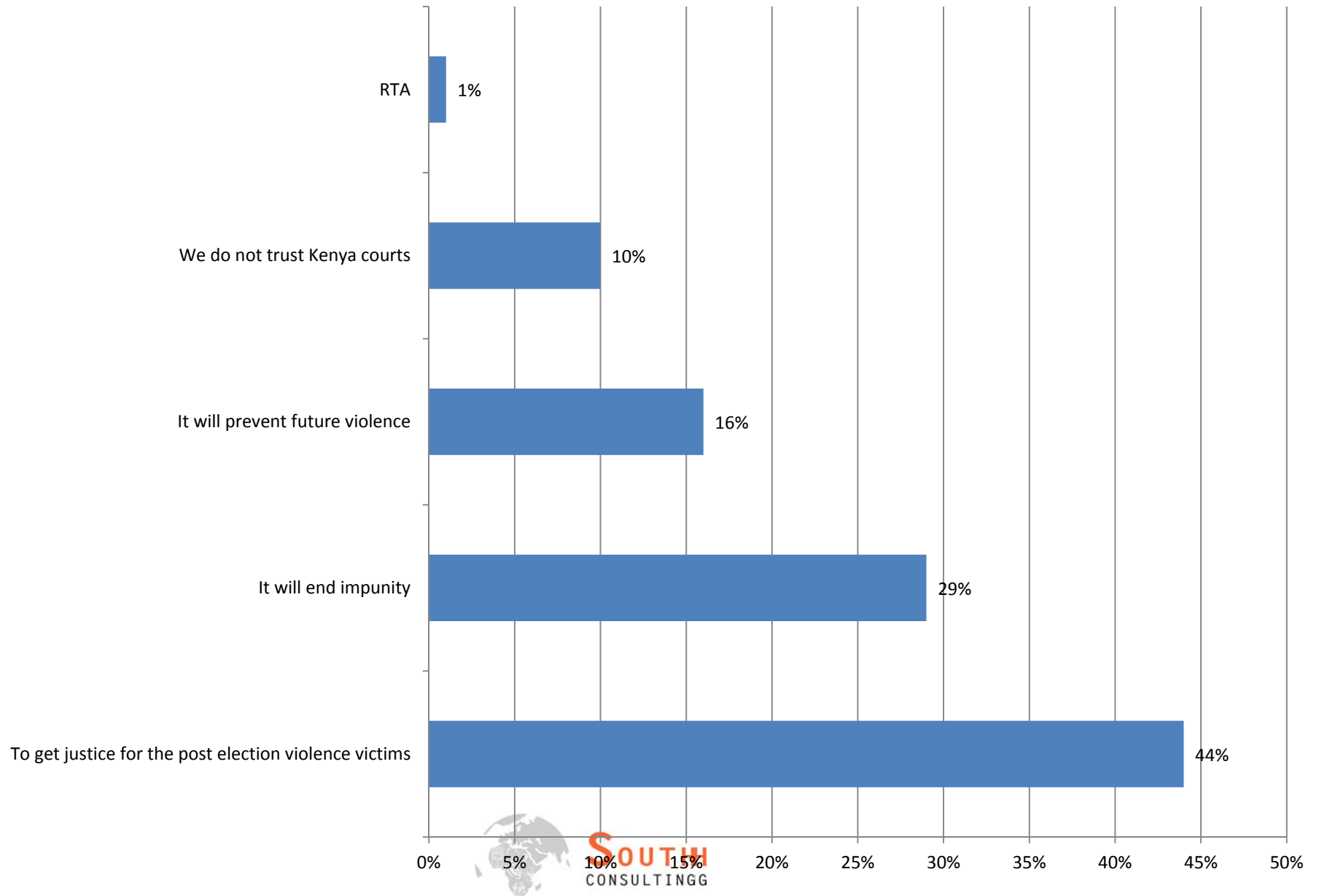

Are you happy or unhappy that The Hague/the ICC is pursuing the six suspects of the post election violence (PEV)? (by Total)



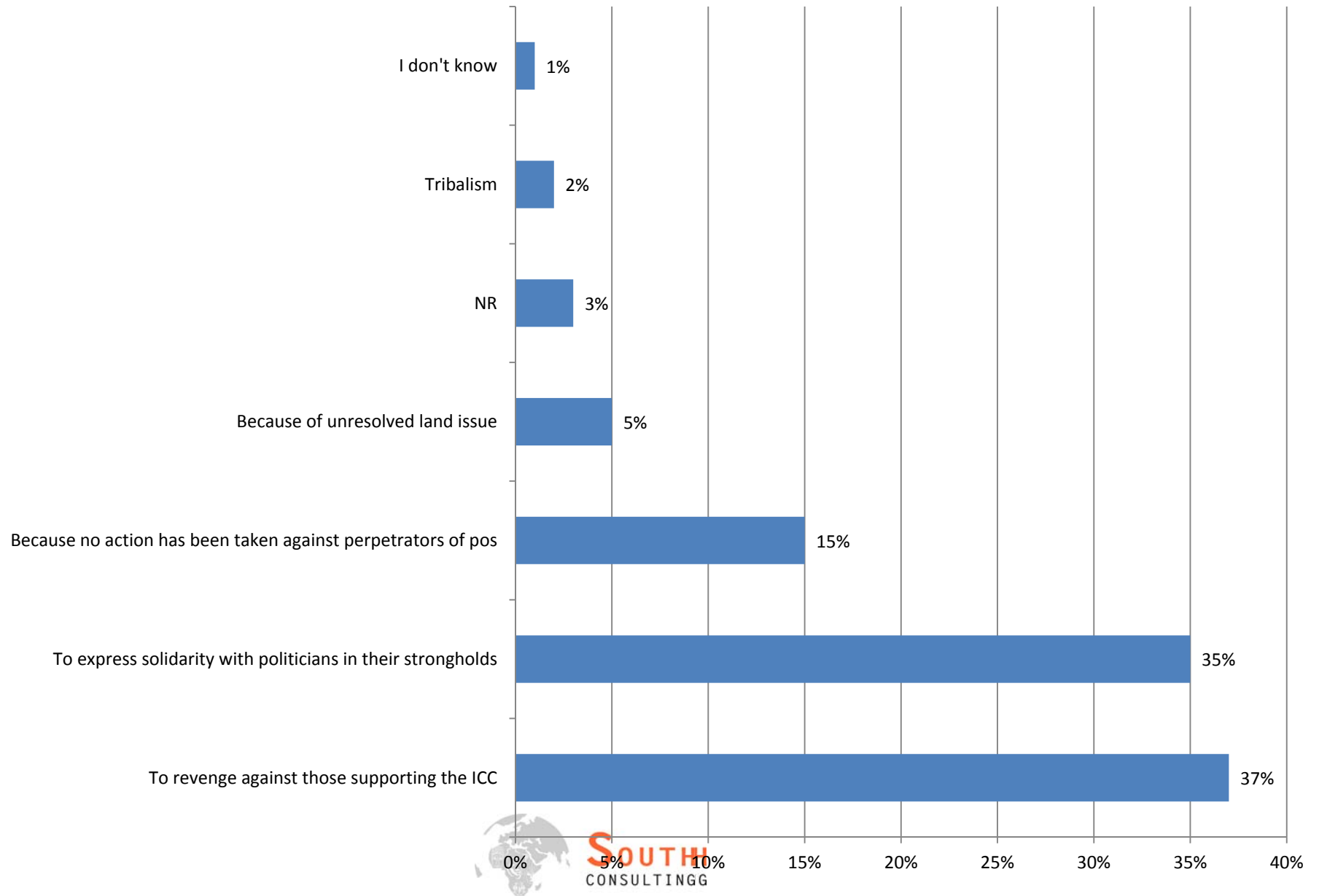

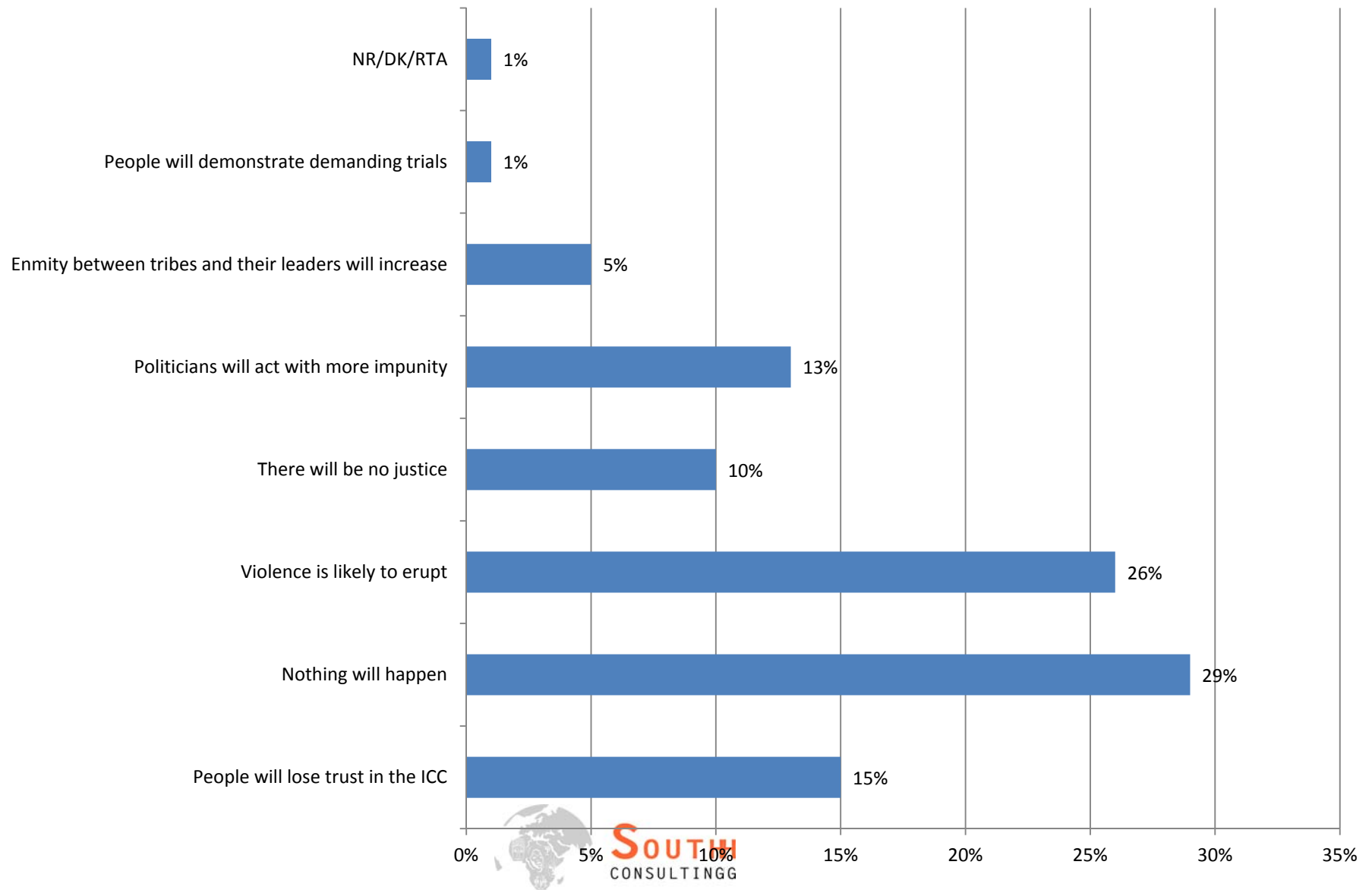

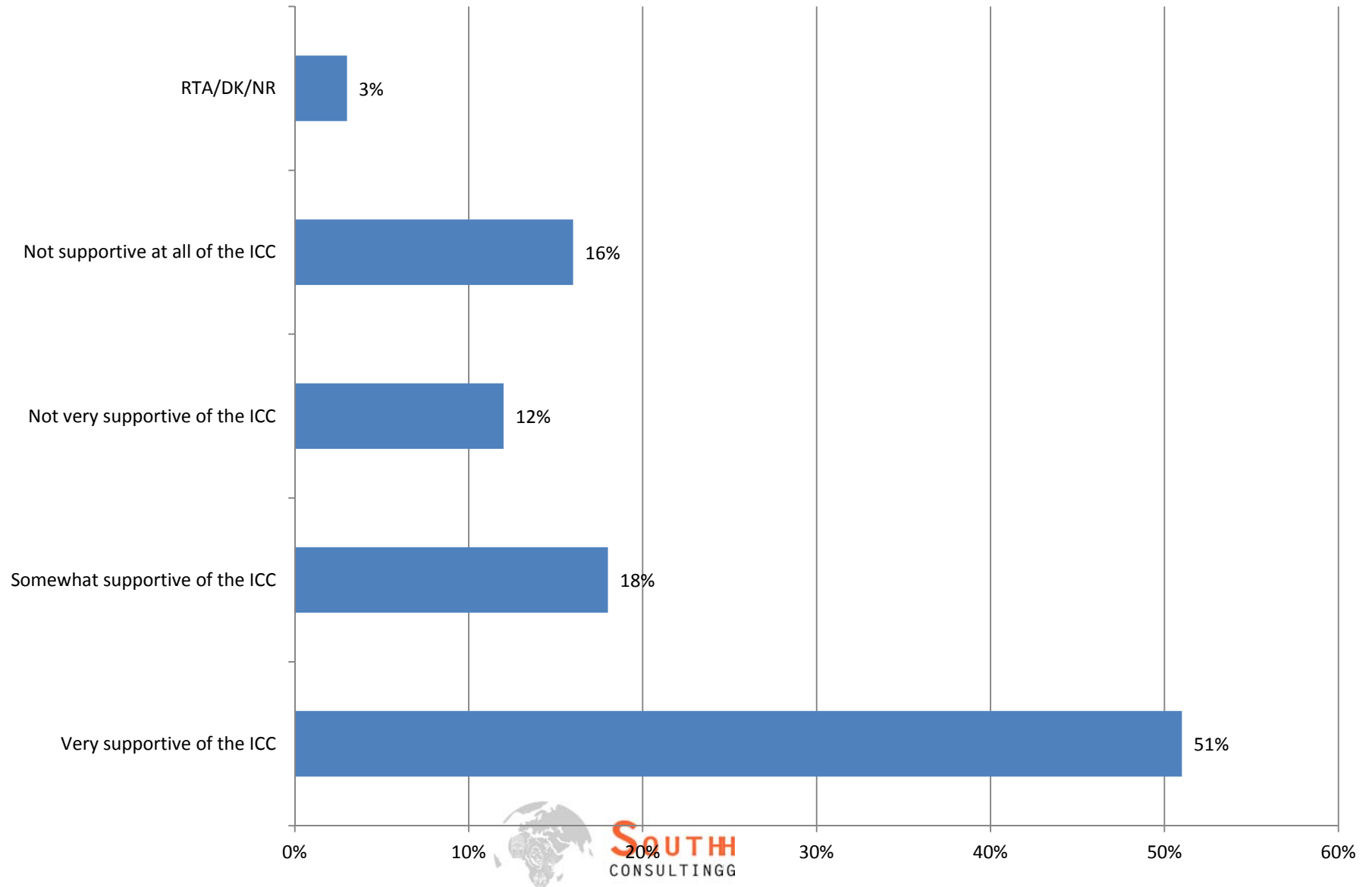
Why do you think violence will occur in this place? (by Total)



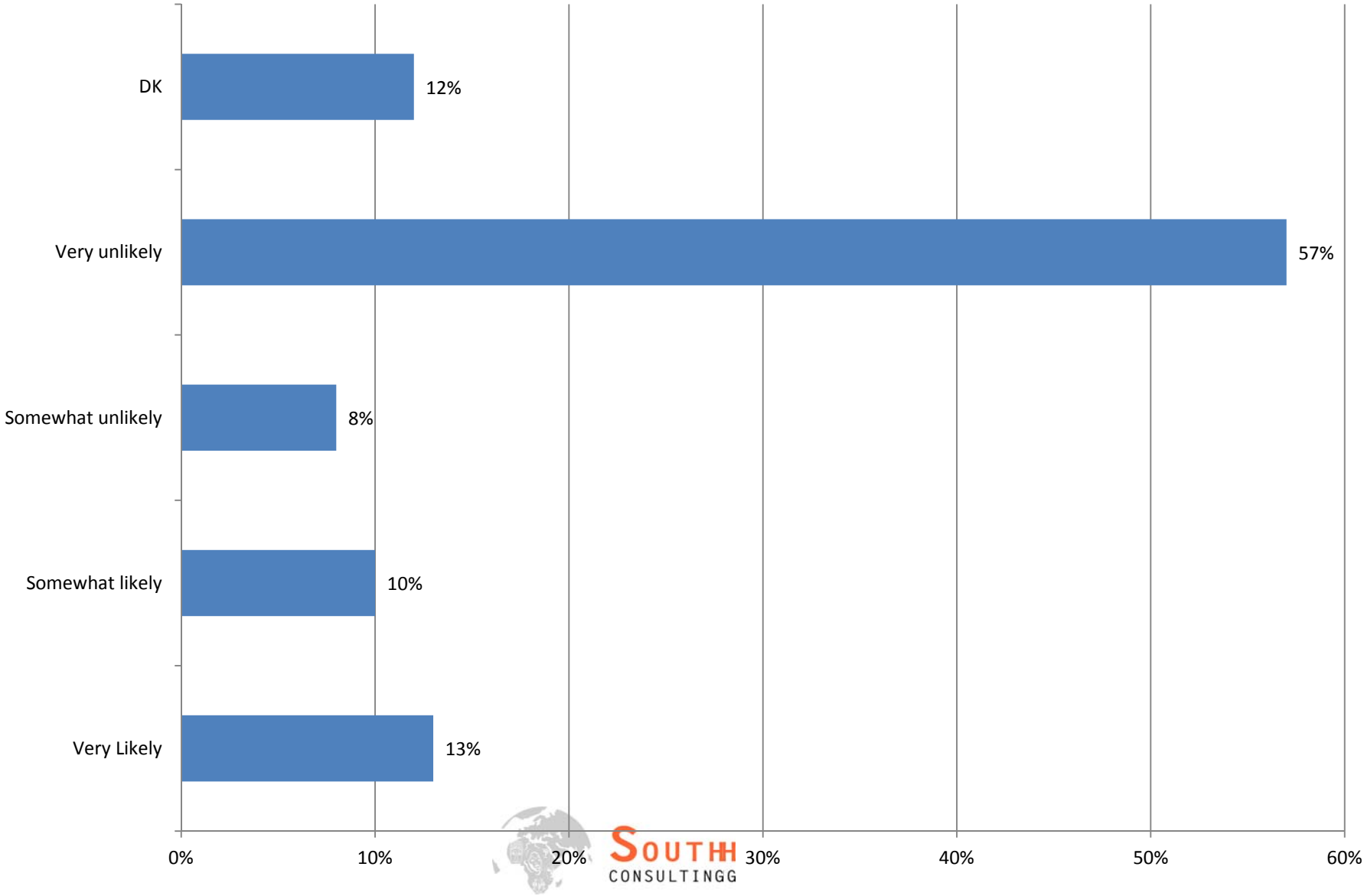
What do you think is most likely to happen if the ICC fails to prosecute any suspects for post-election violence? (by Total)



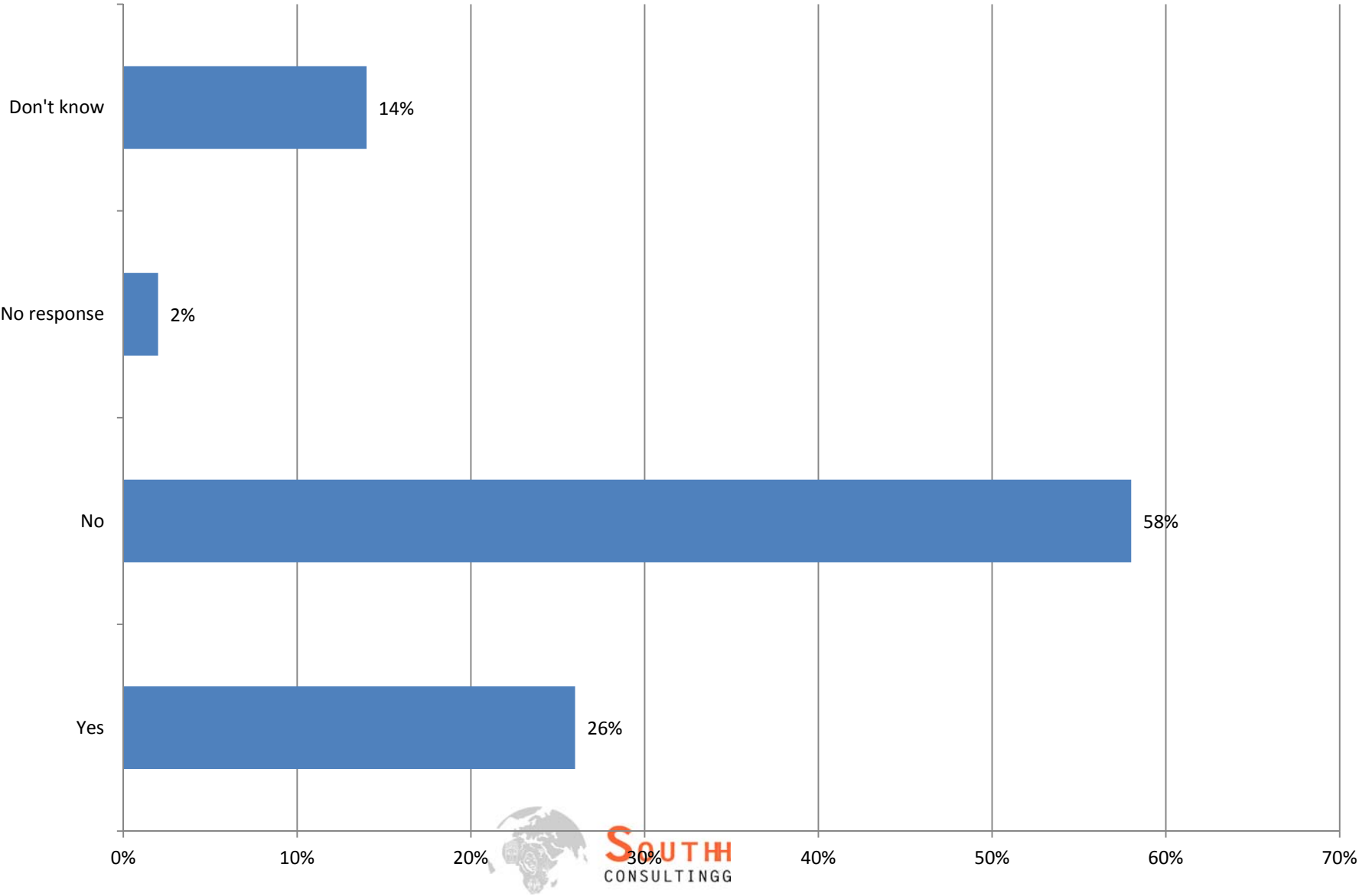
How supportive or not supportive are you of ICCs efforts to prosecute the 6 people named by Ocampo as PEV suspects? (by Total)



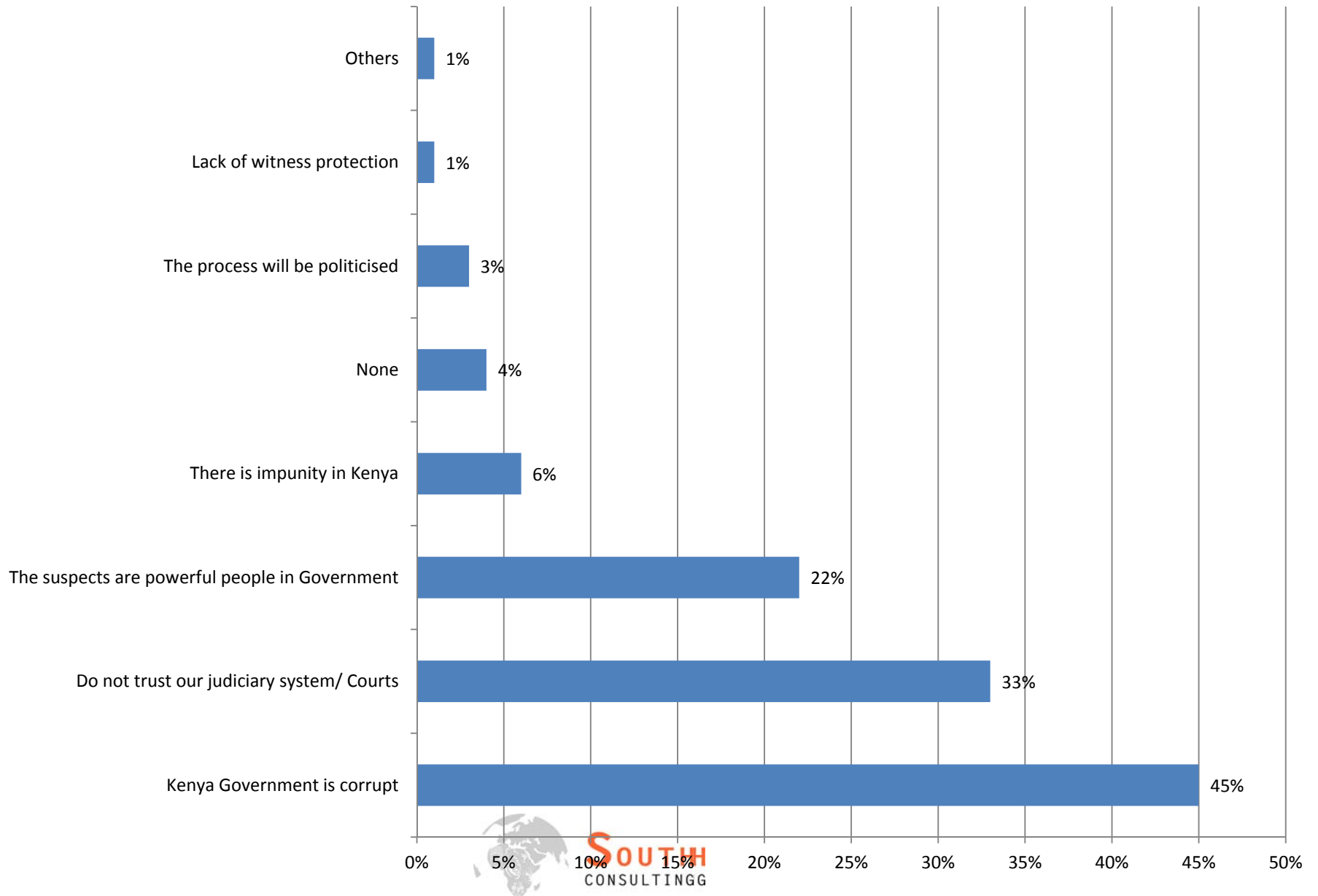
If the ICC trials take place, how likely do you think it is to produce violence in Kenya? (by Total)



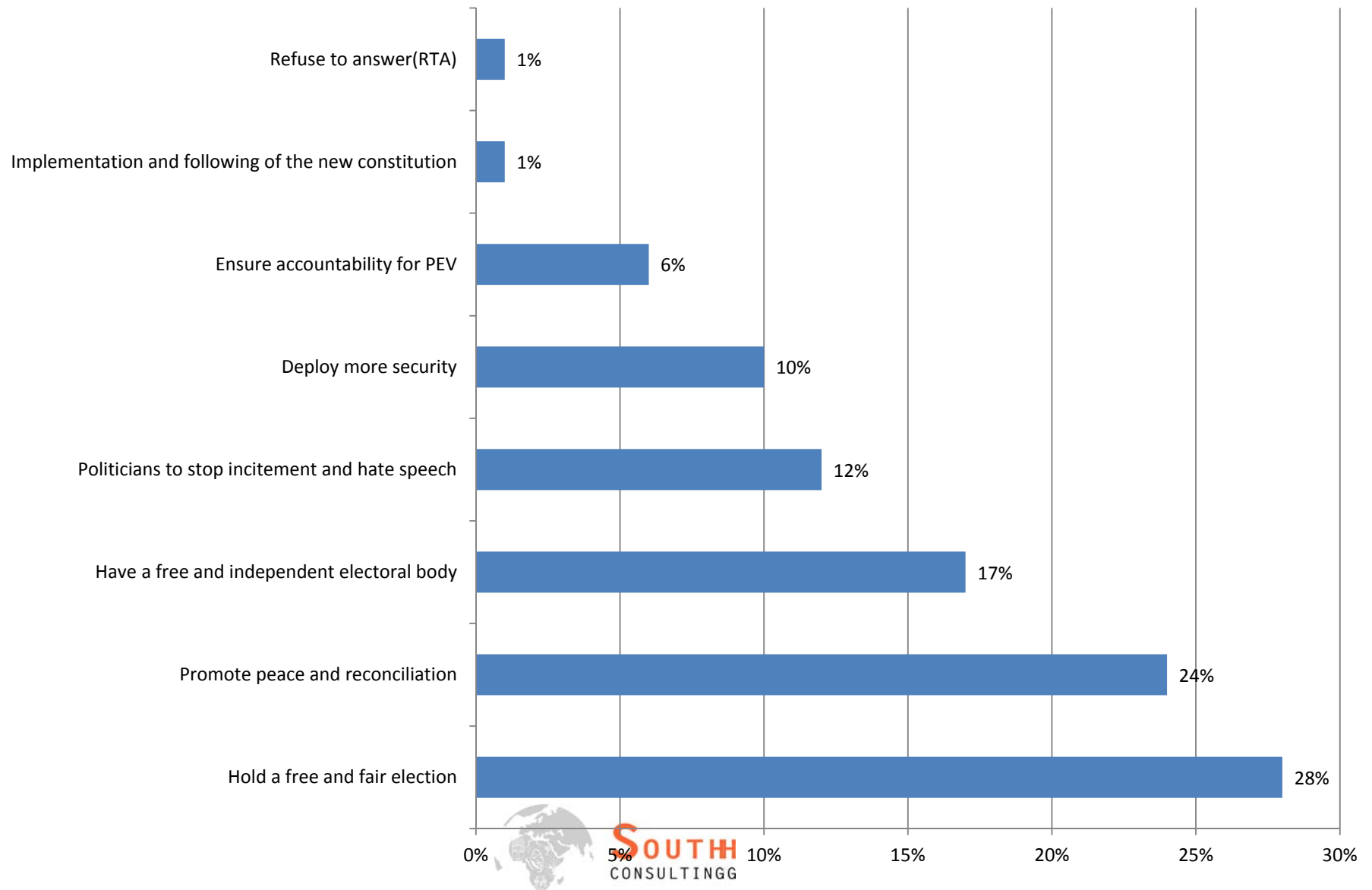
Do you think the Kenya government can conduct genuine investigations and prosecutions of the 6 suspects named by Ocampo/ICC? (by Total)

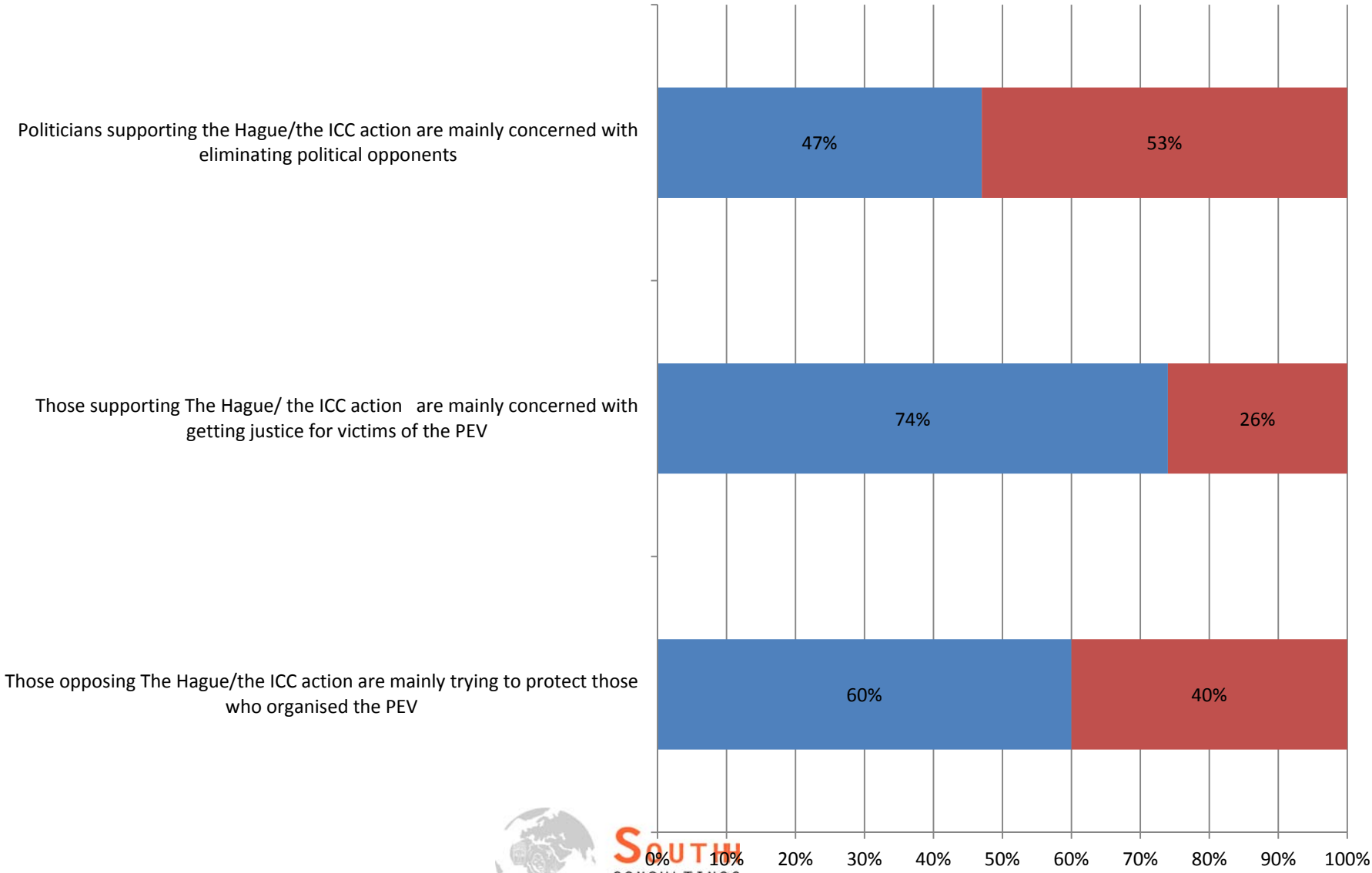


What would you say is the MOST IMPORTANT way to prevent future political violence in Kenya? (by Total)

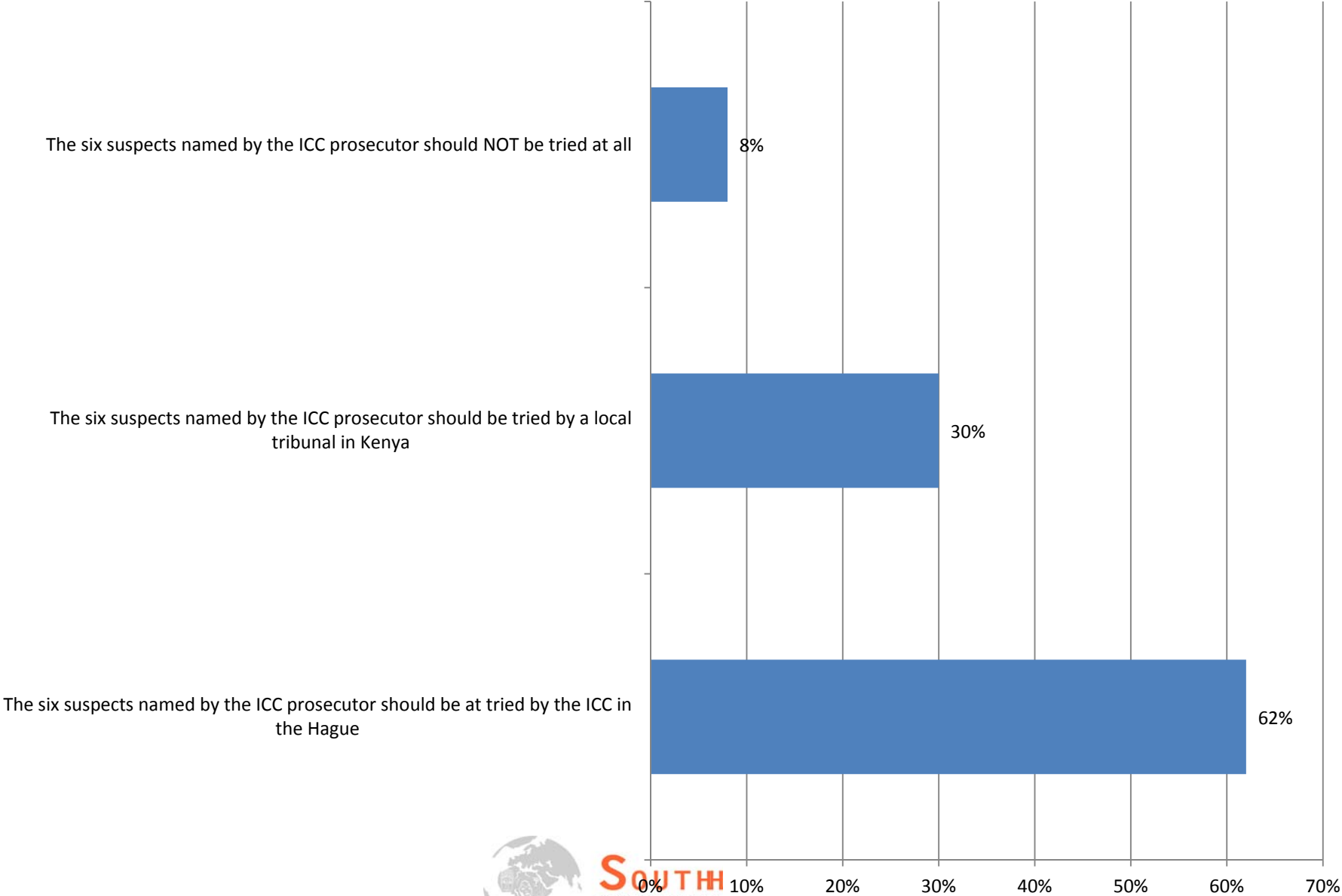

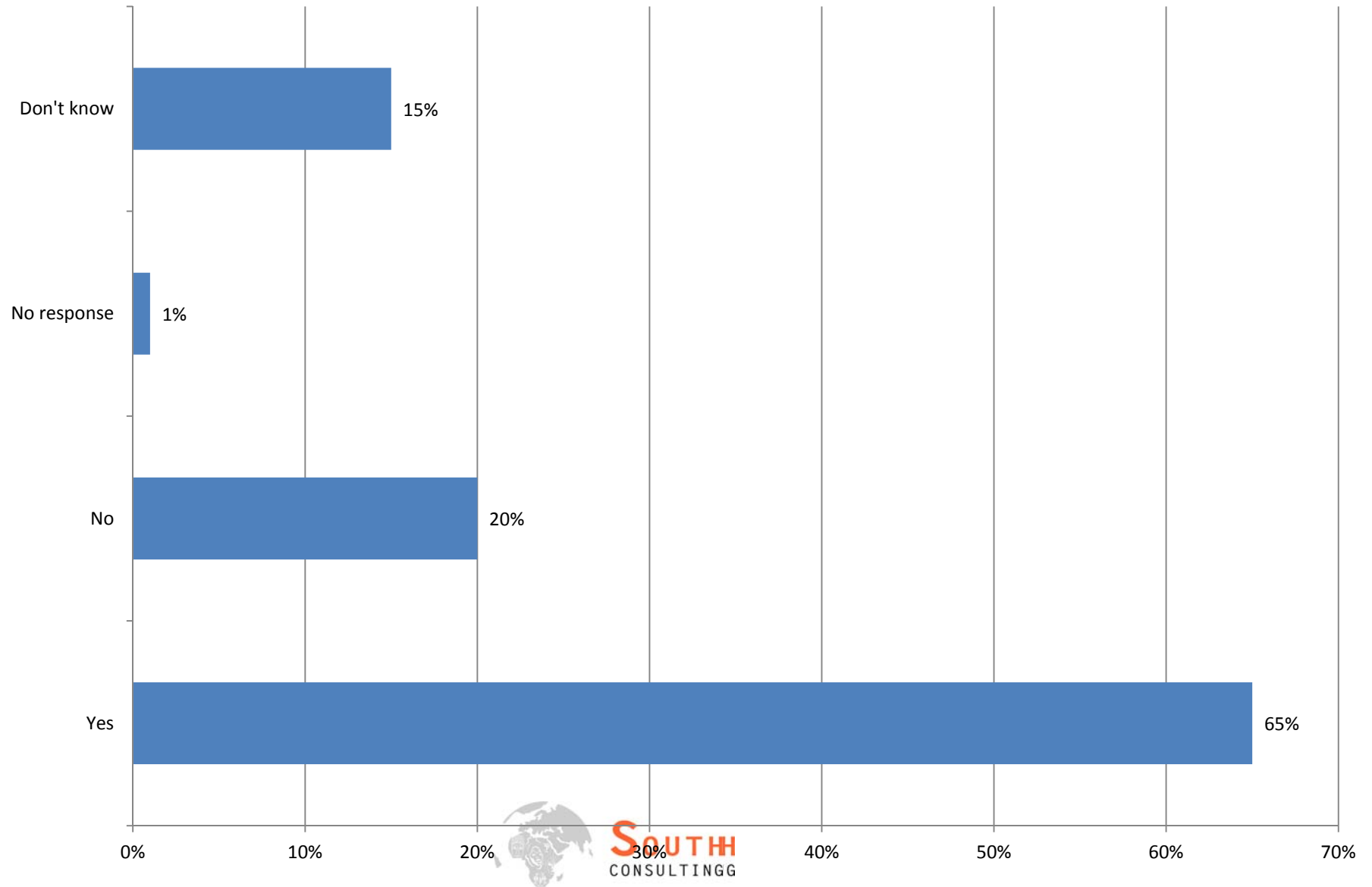

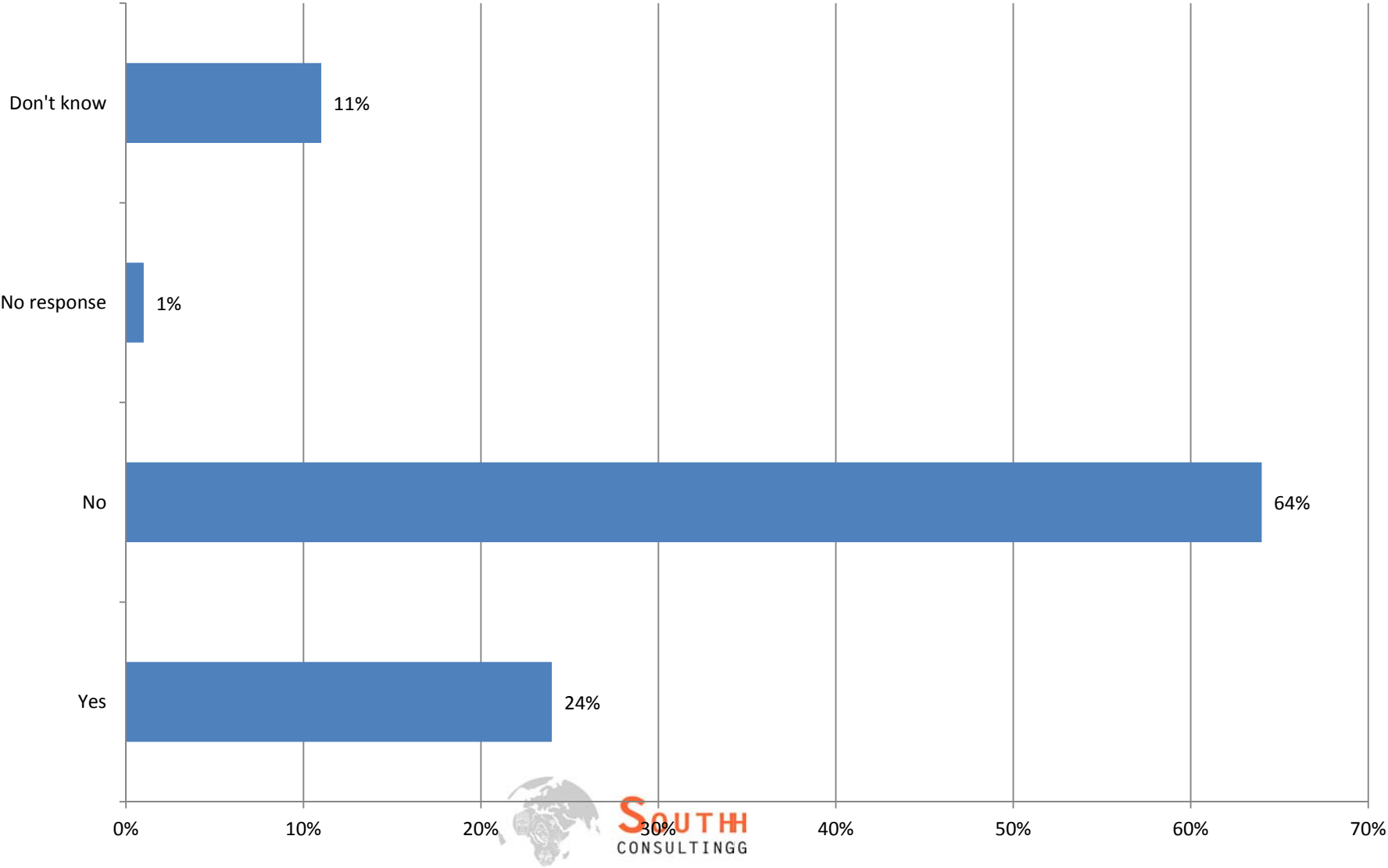

Do you believe the ICC can/will protect its witnesses that will give evidence against the Ocampo 6? (by Total)



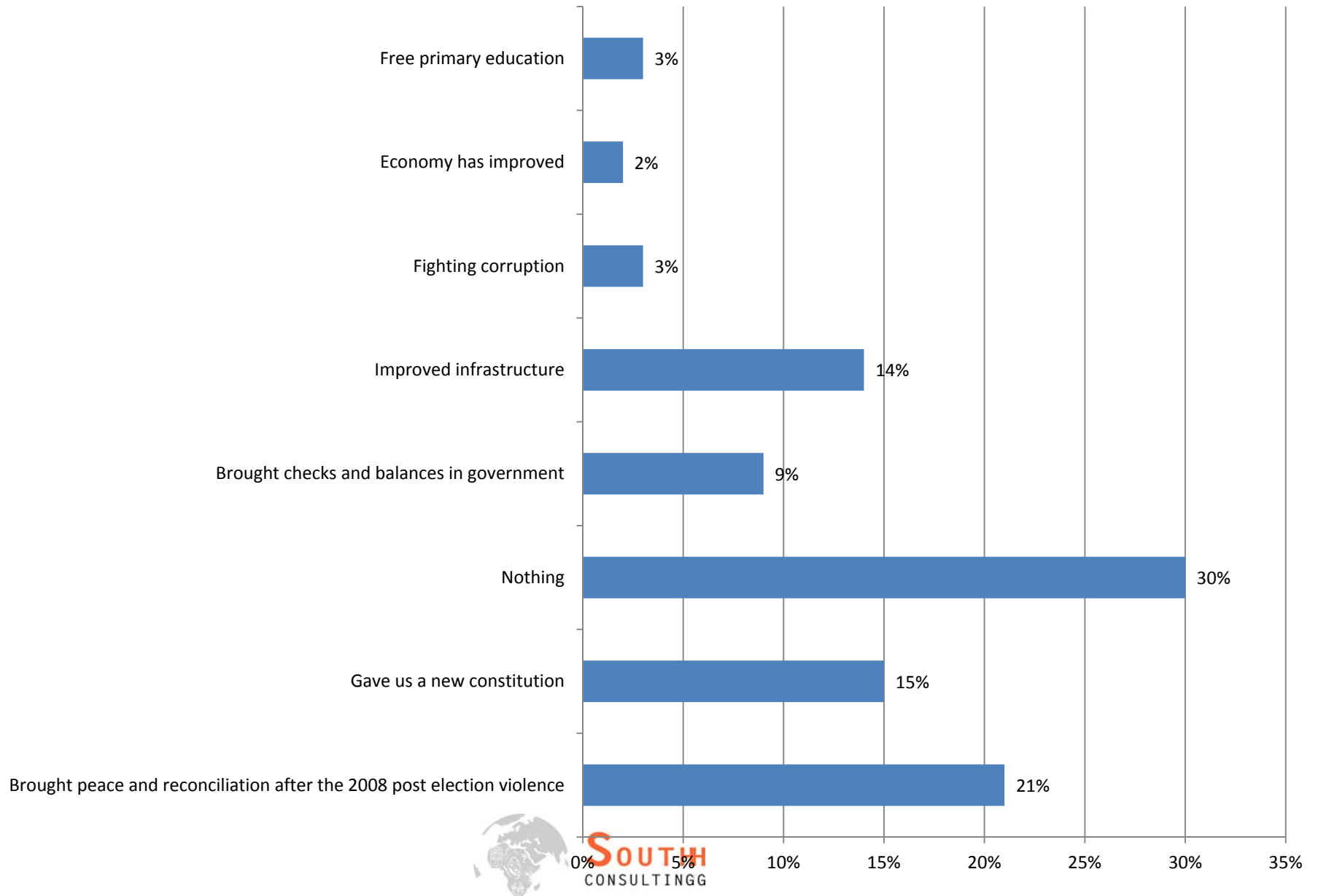

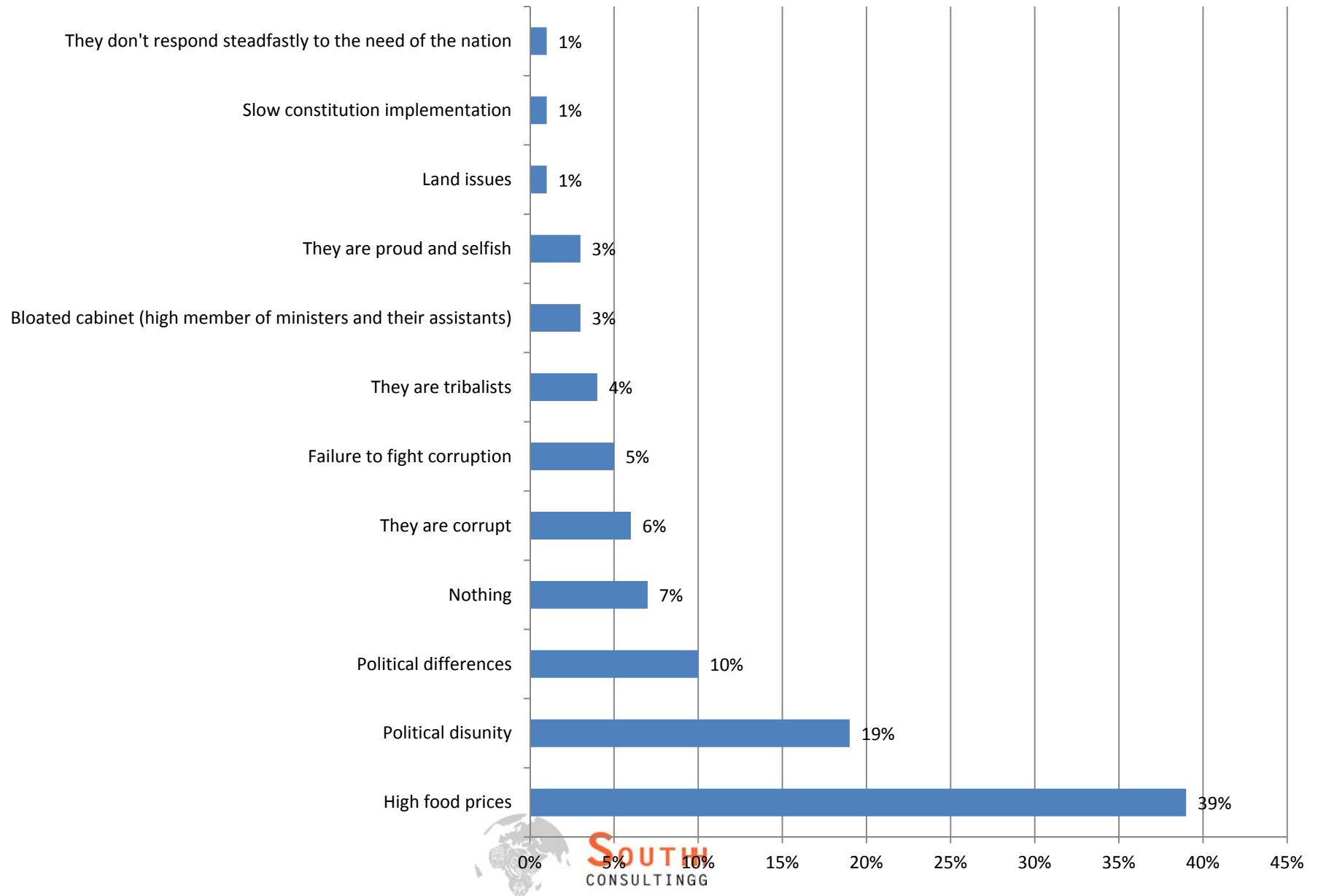

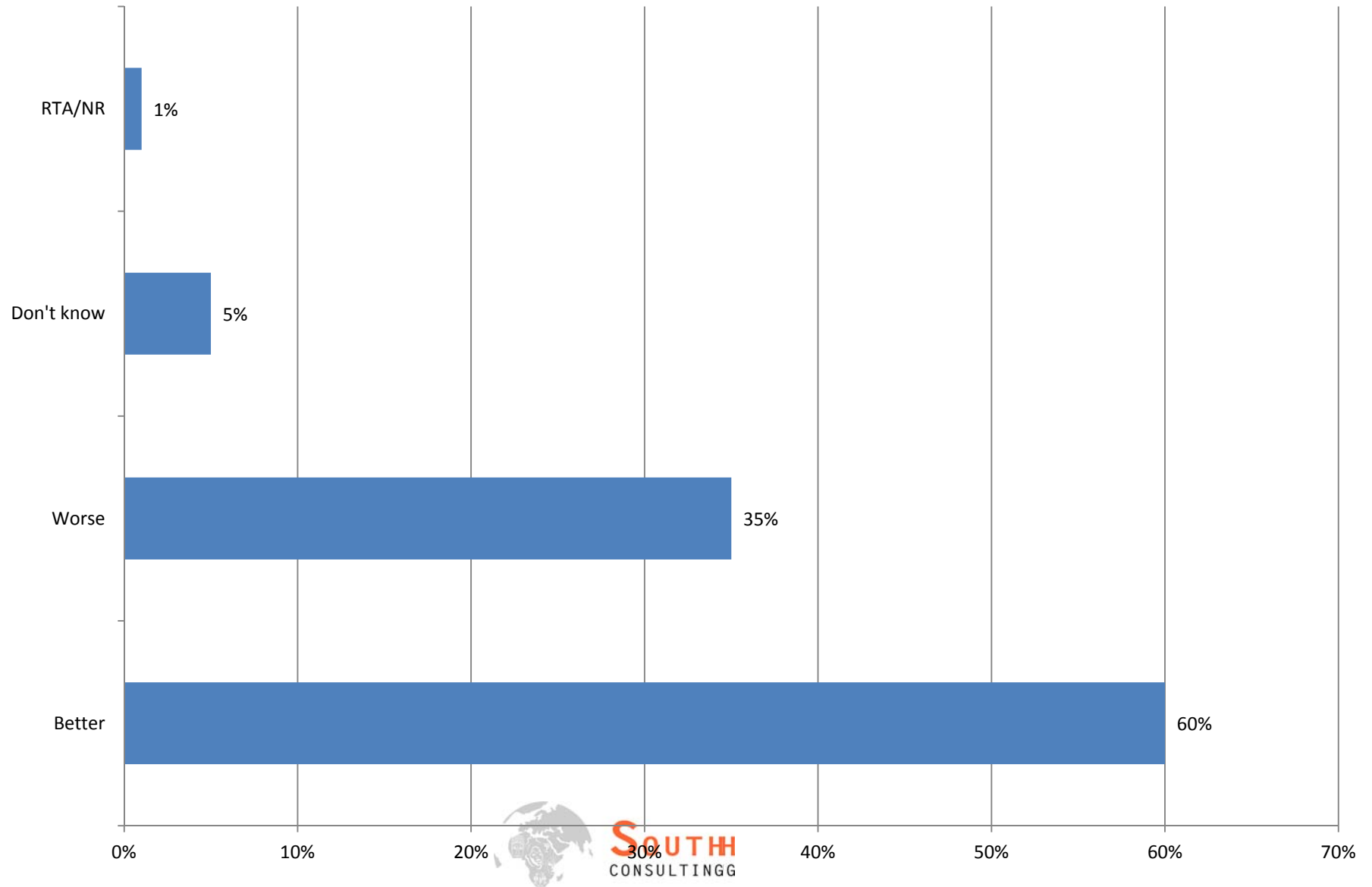

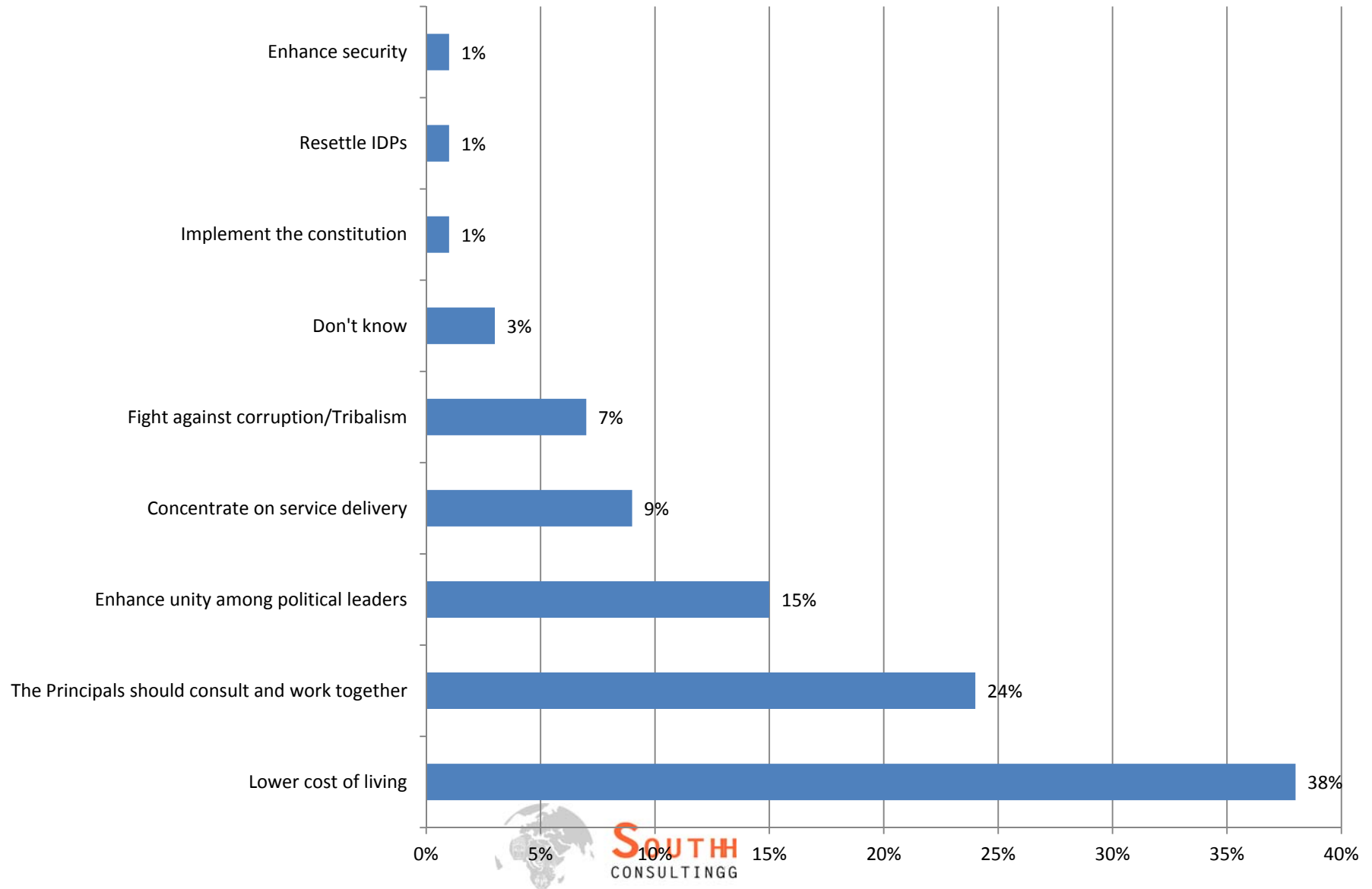

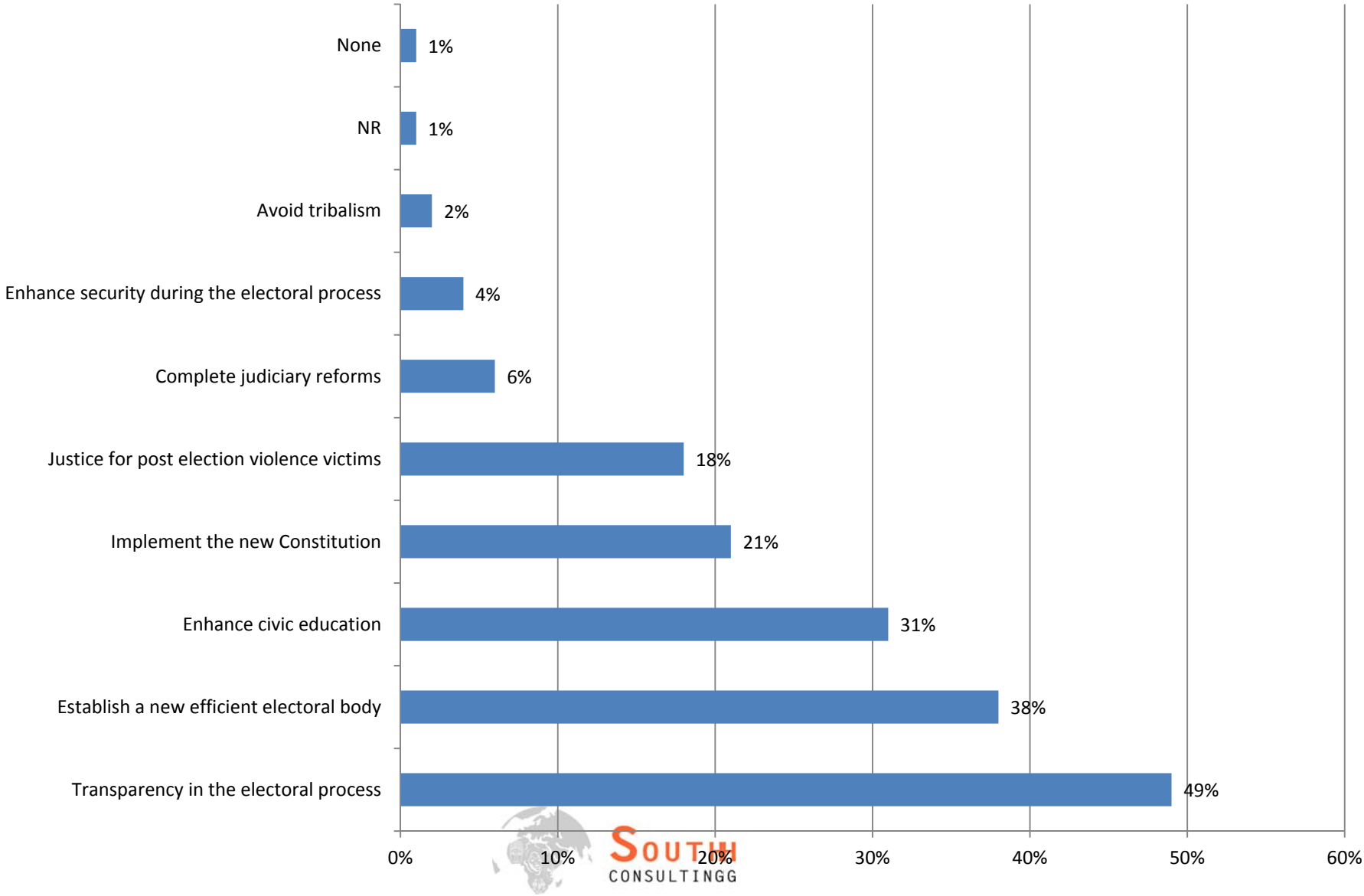

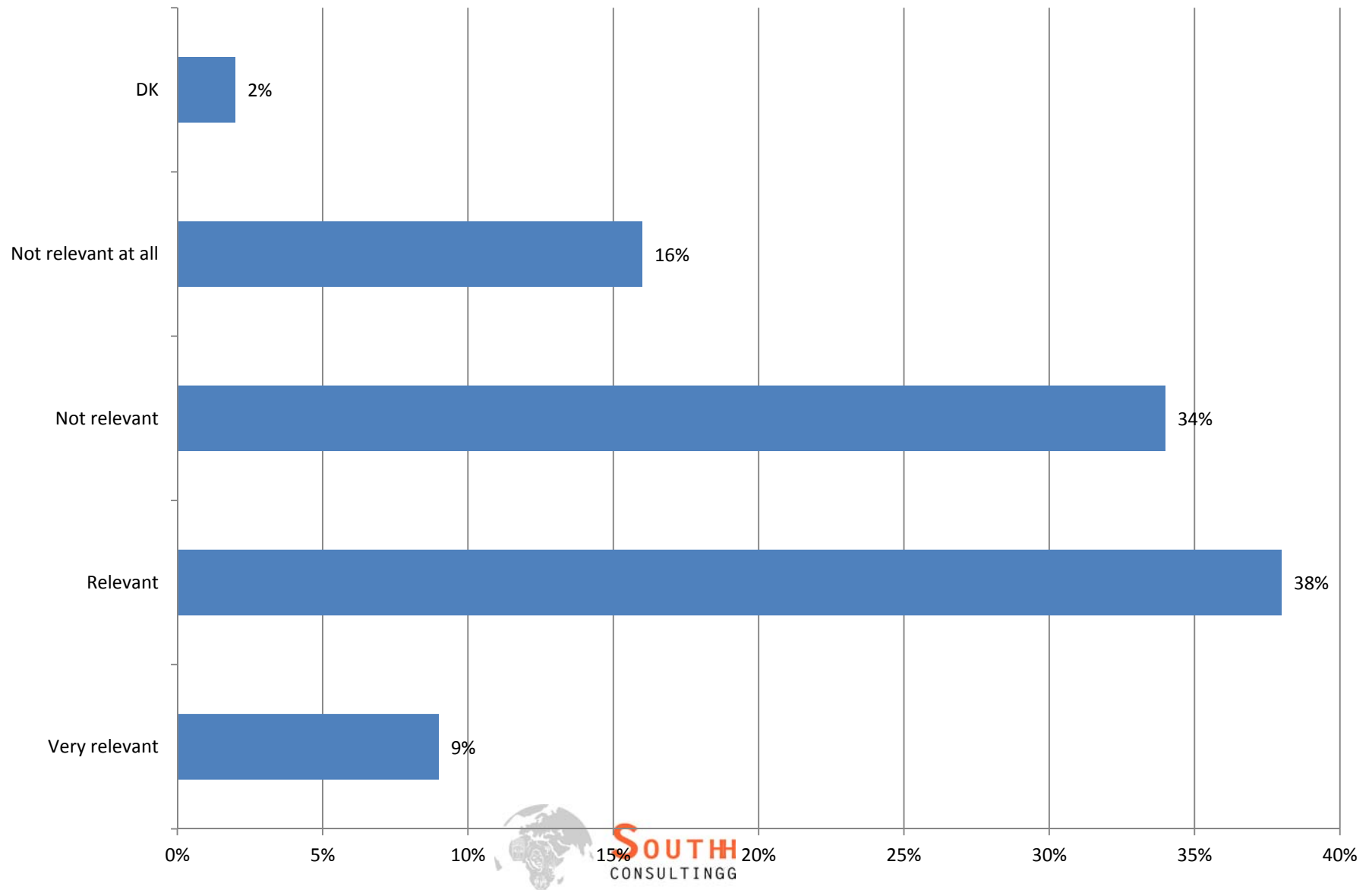

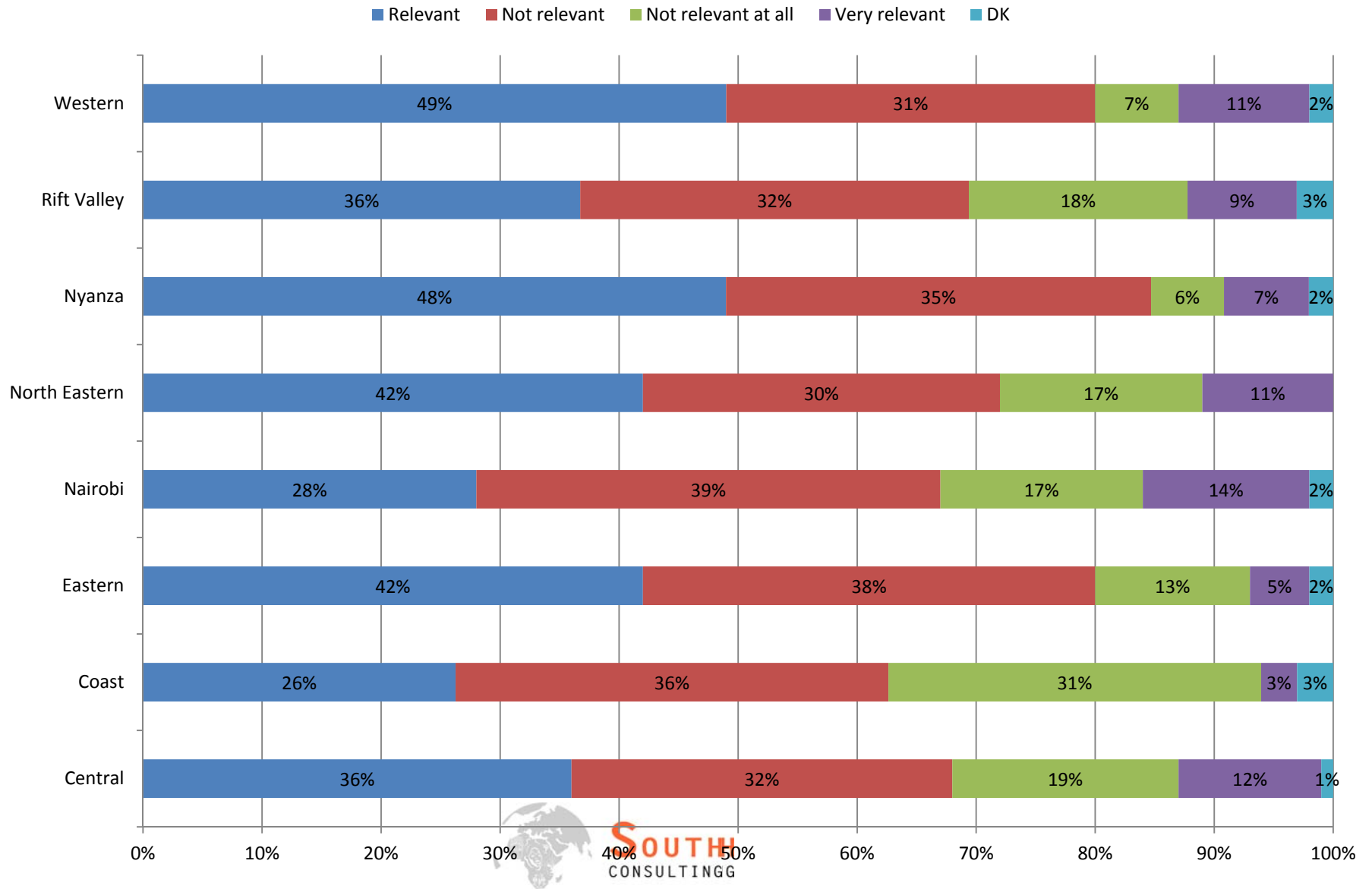

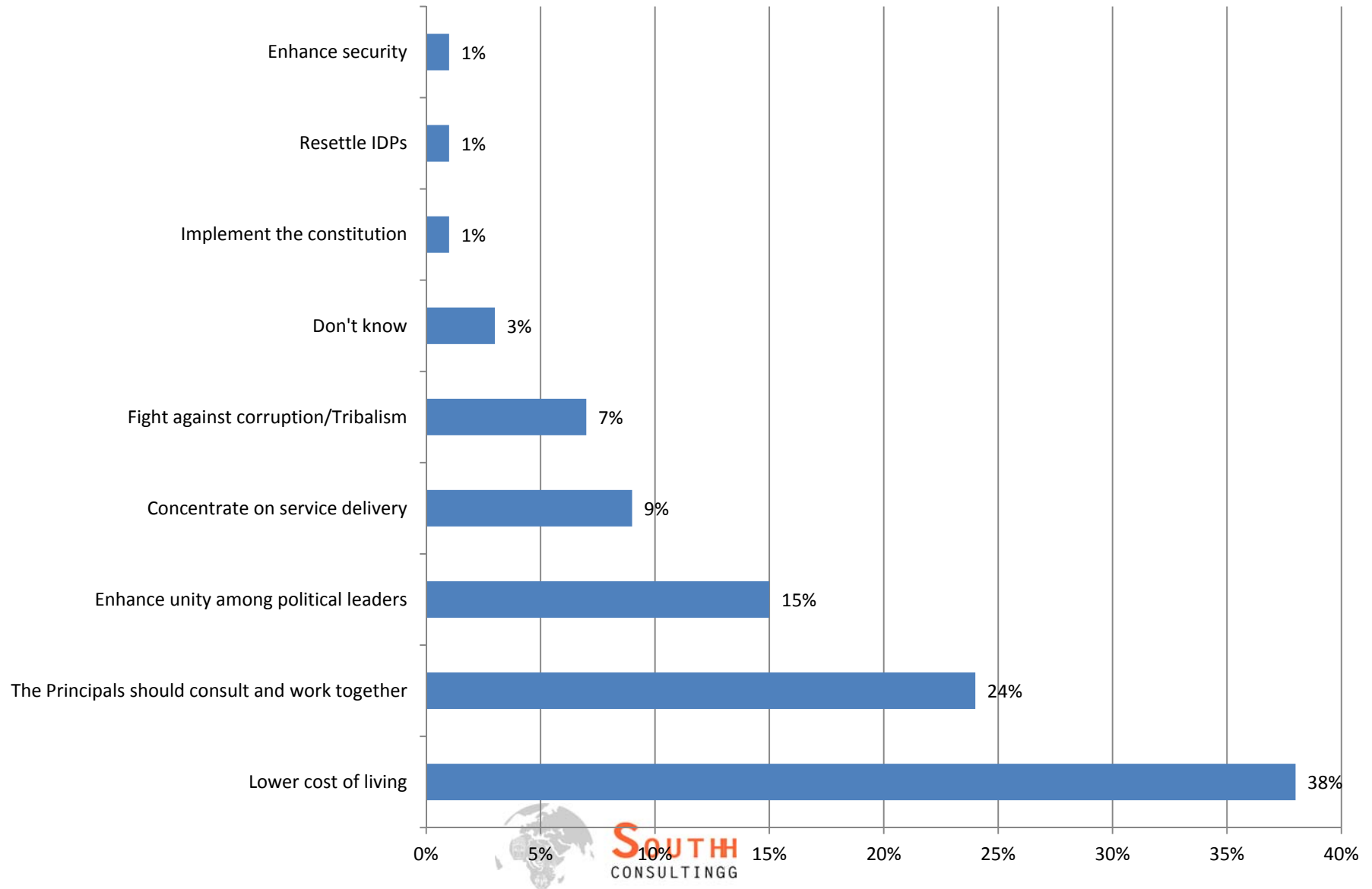
In your opinion, how relevant is power-sharing between PNU and ODM today? (by Total)

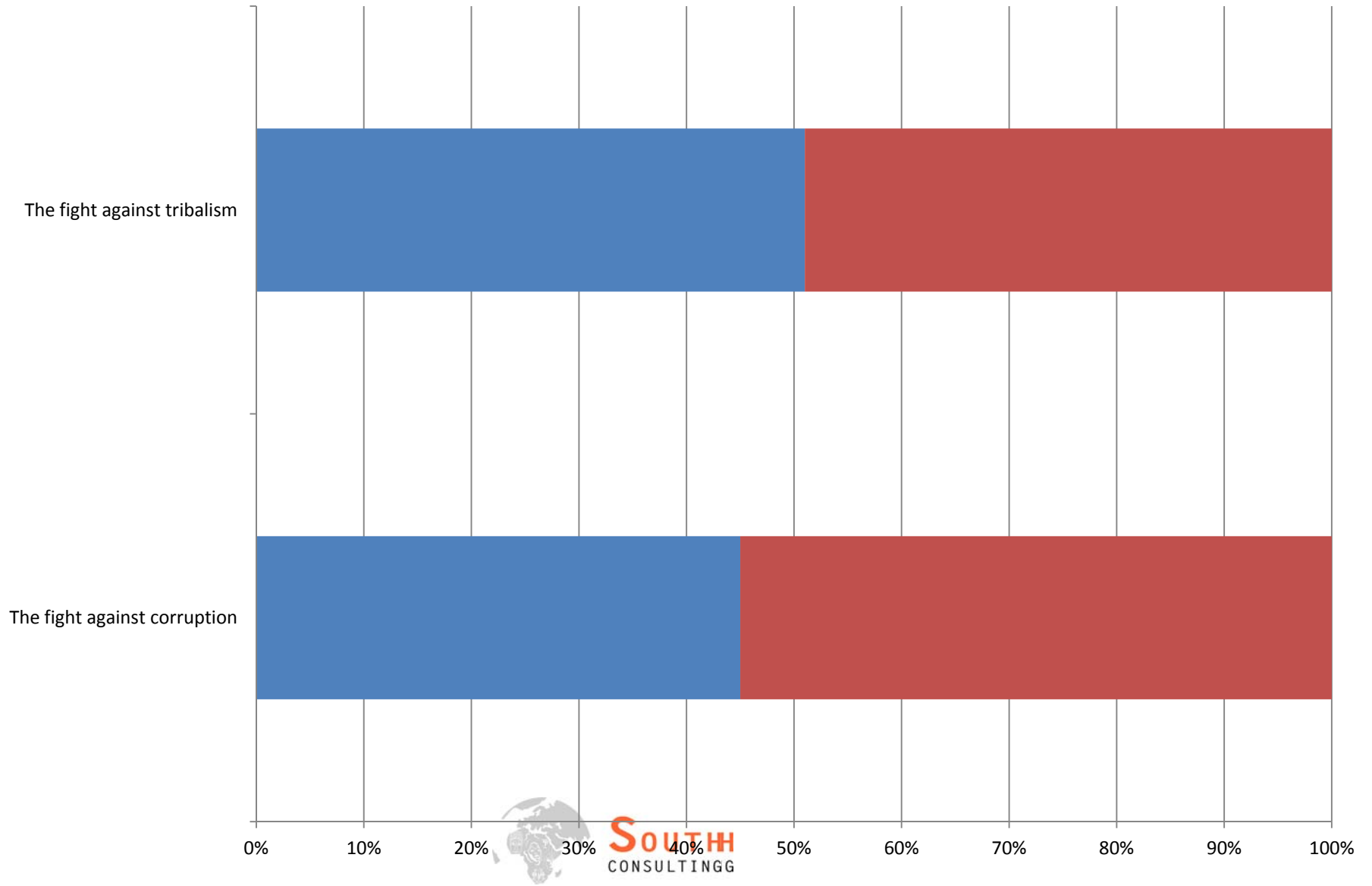

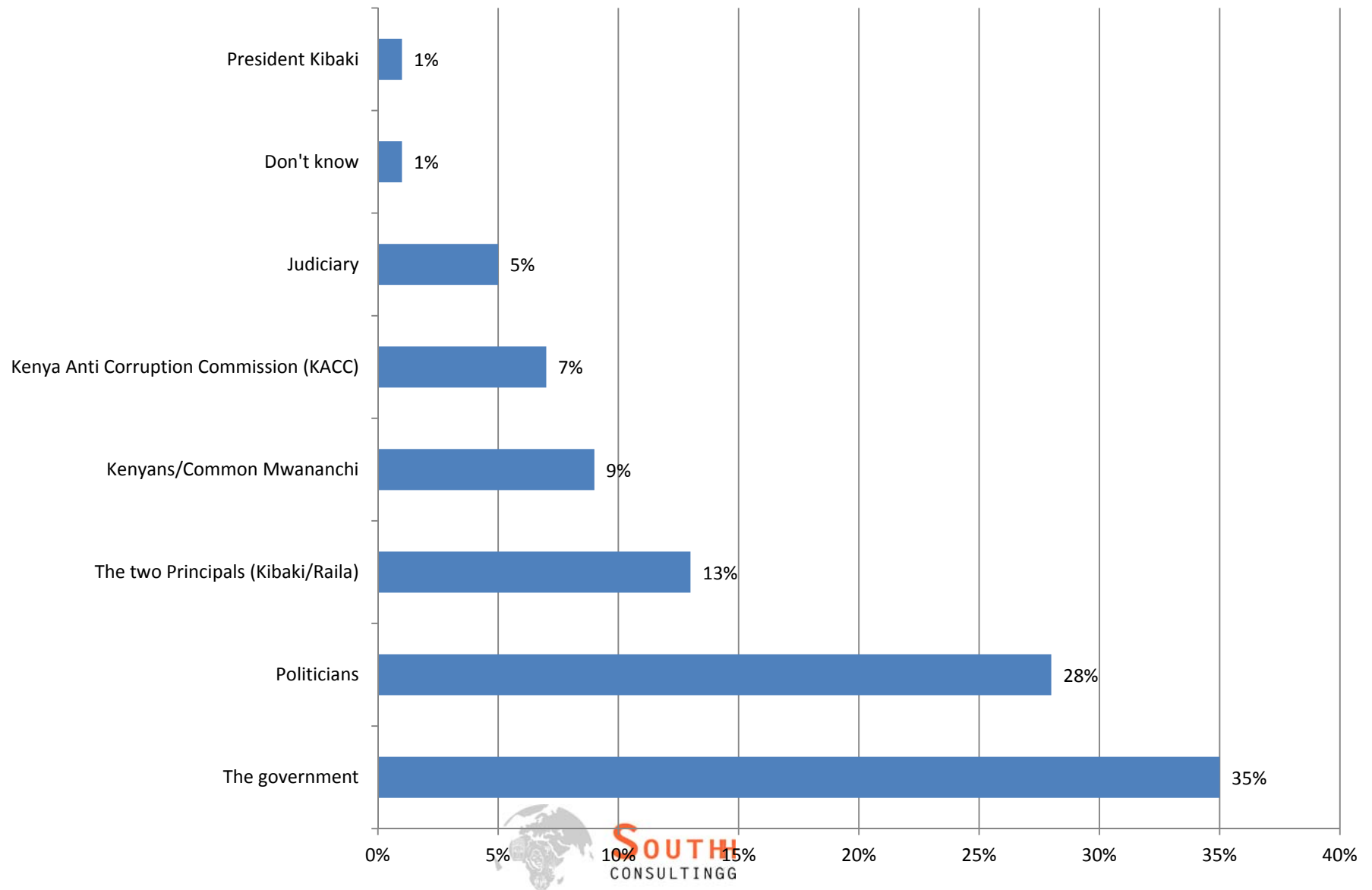

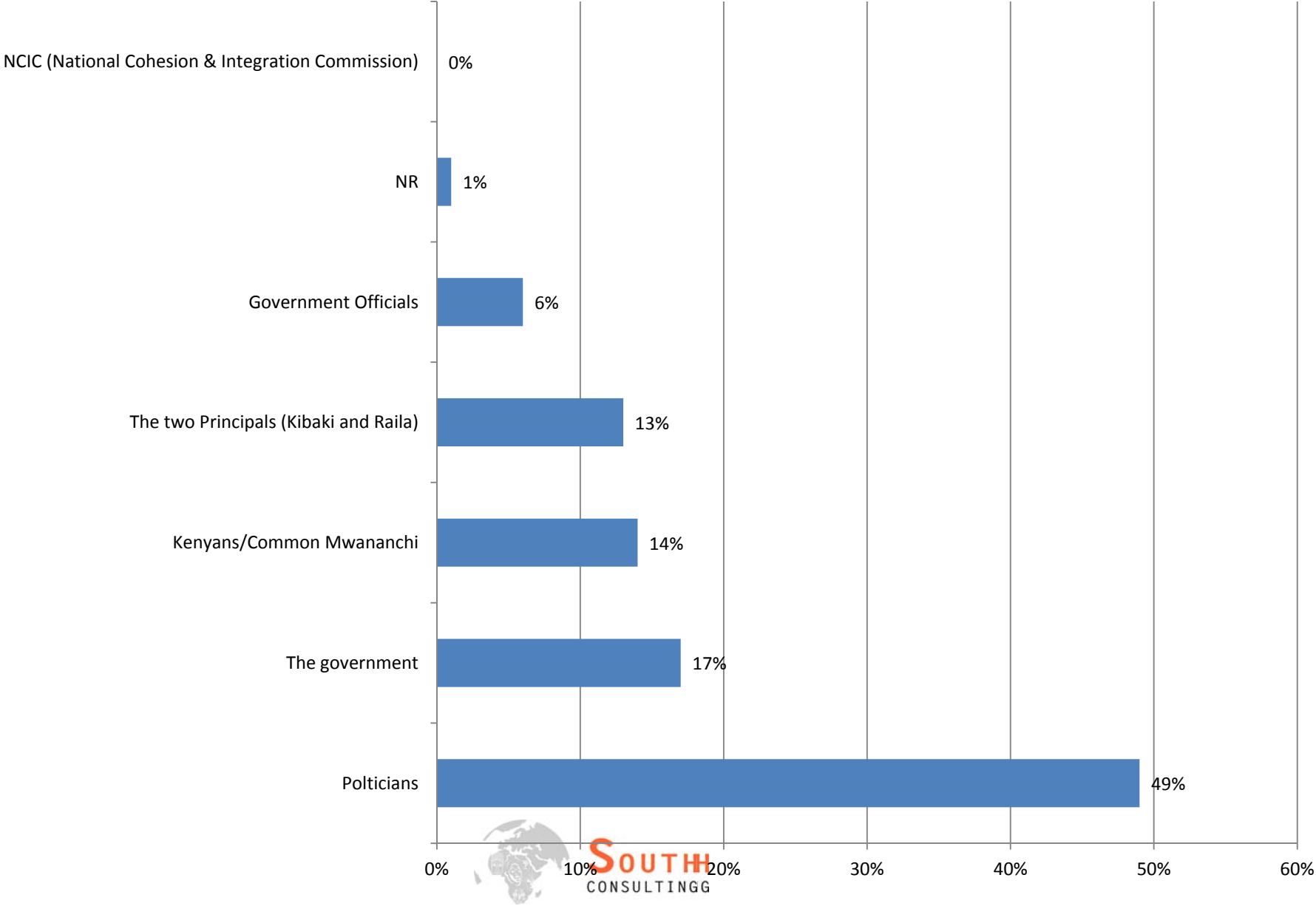

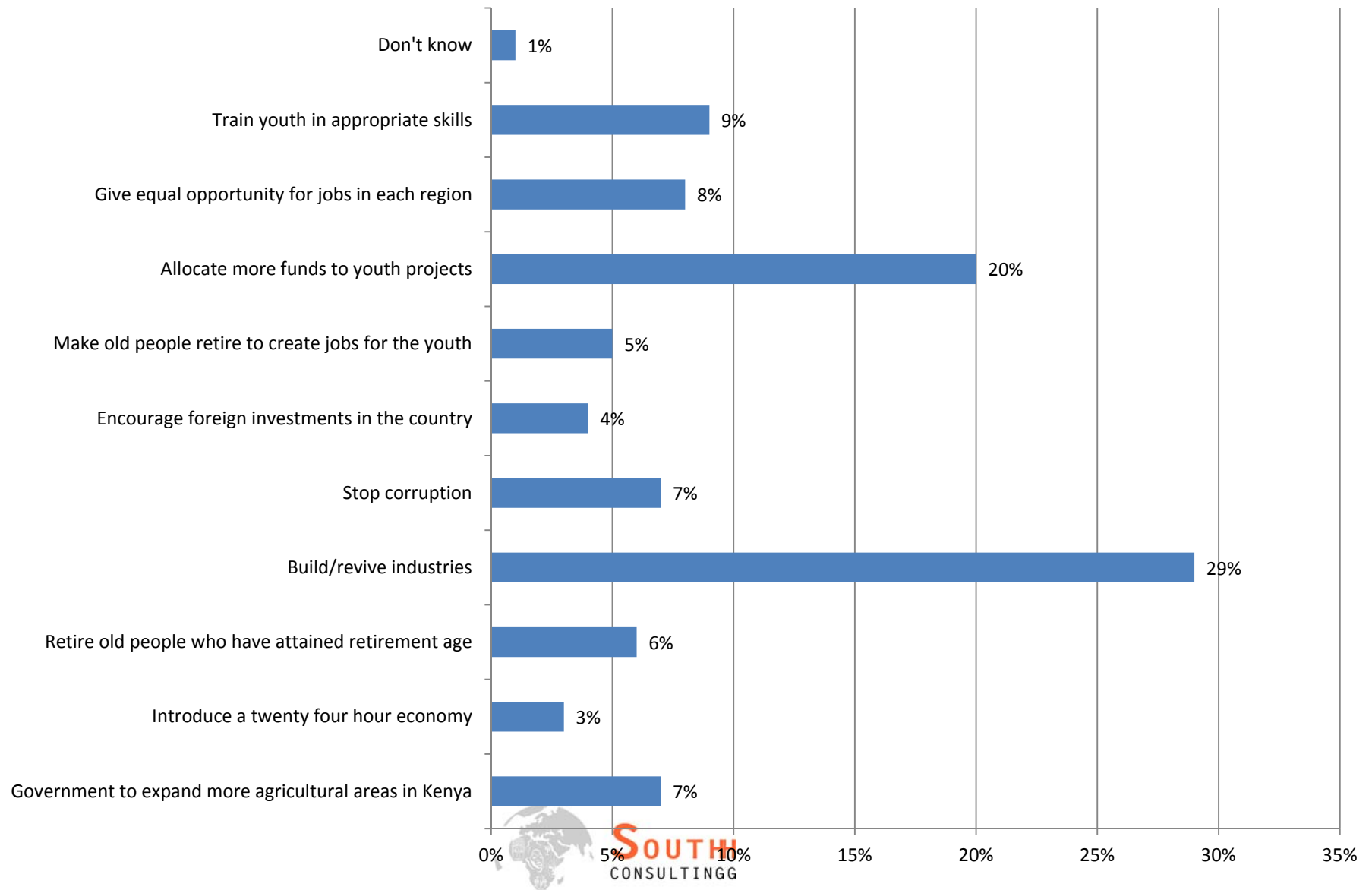

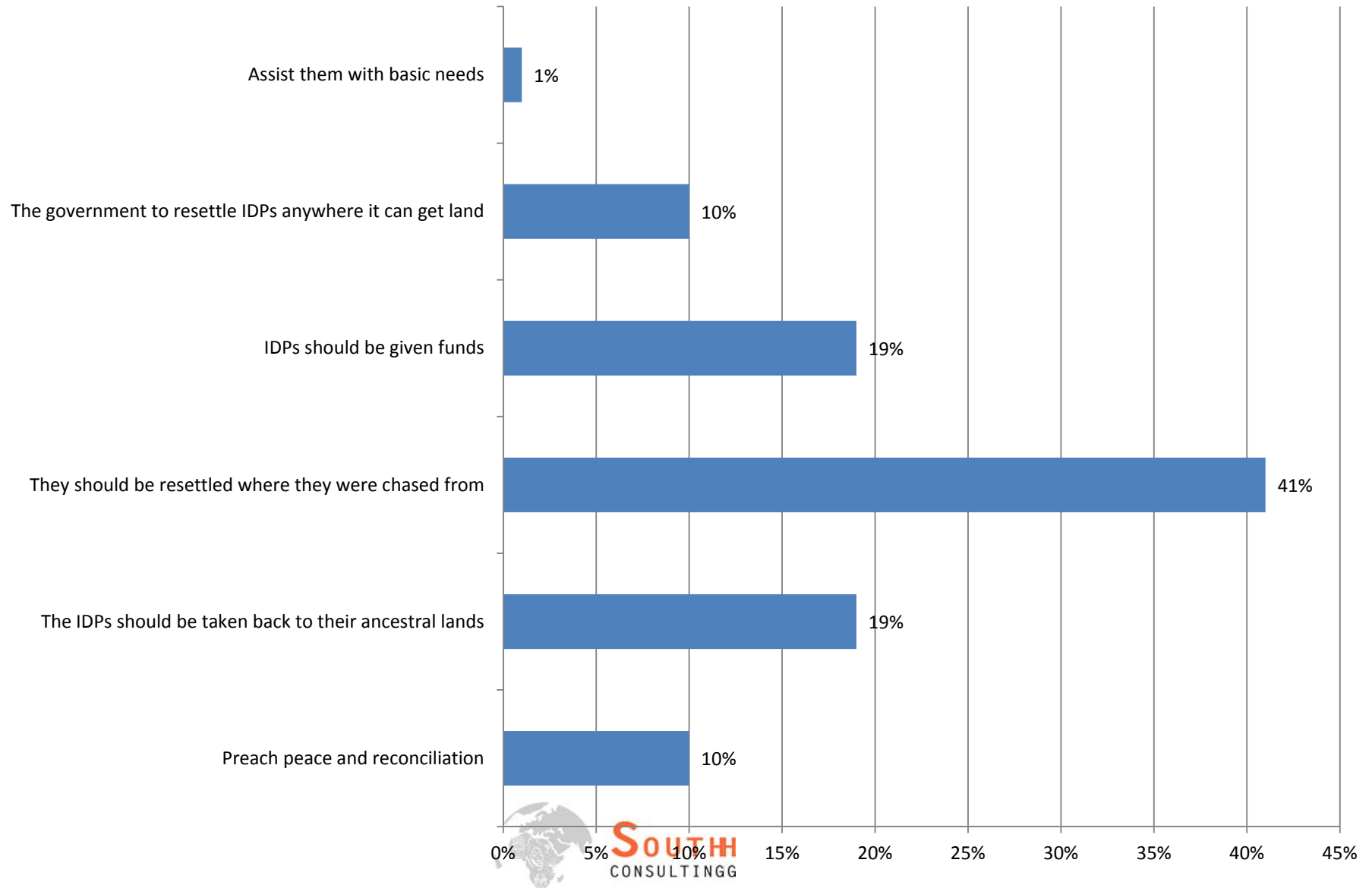


What is the most important step that the government can take to create more jobs for the youth? (by Total)



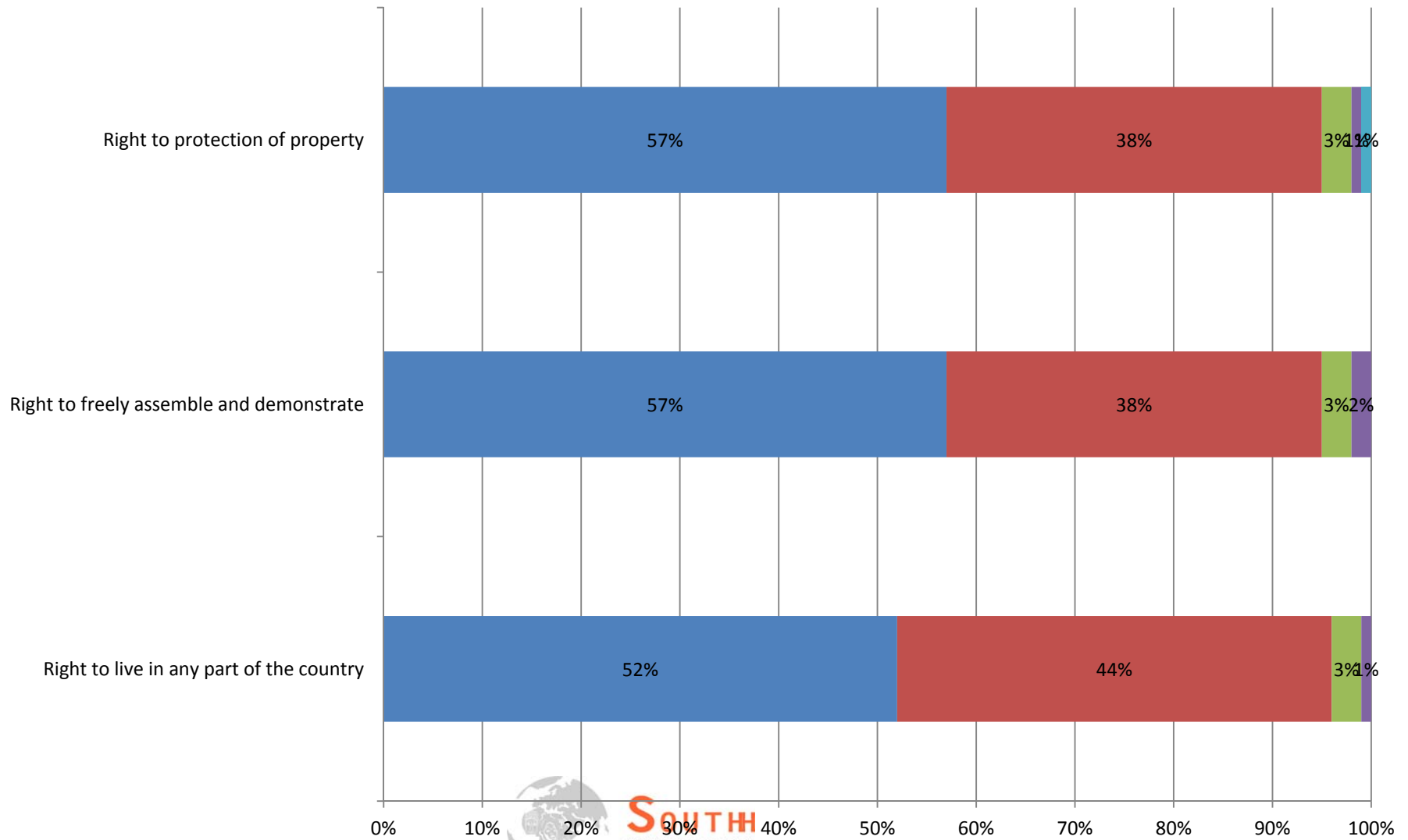

What is the most important thing that the government can do to address the problem of IDPs in Kenya? (by Total)



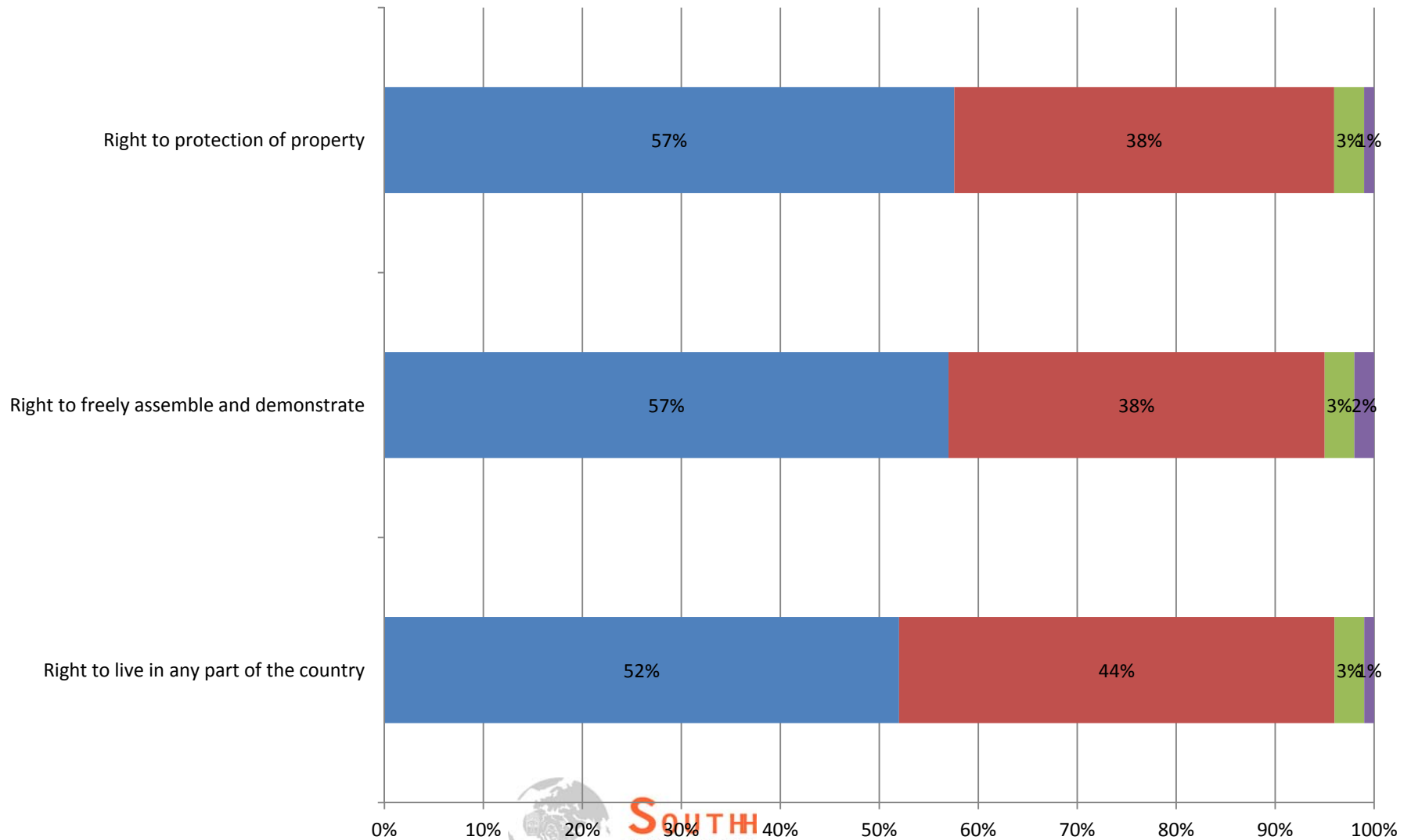
Do you think IDP are able to enjoy the following rights as citizens of Kenya?

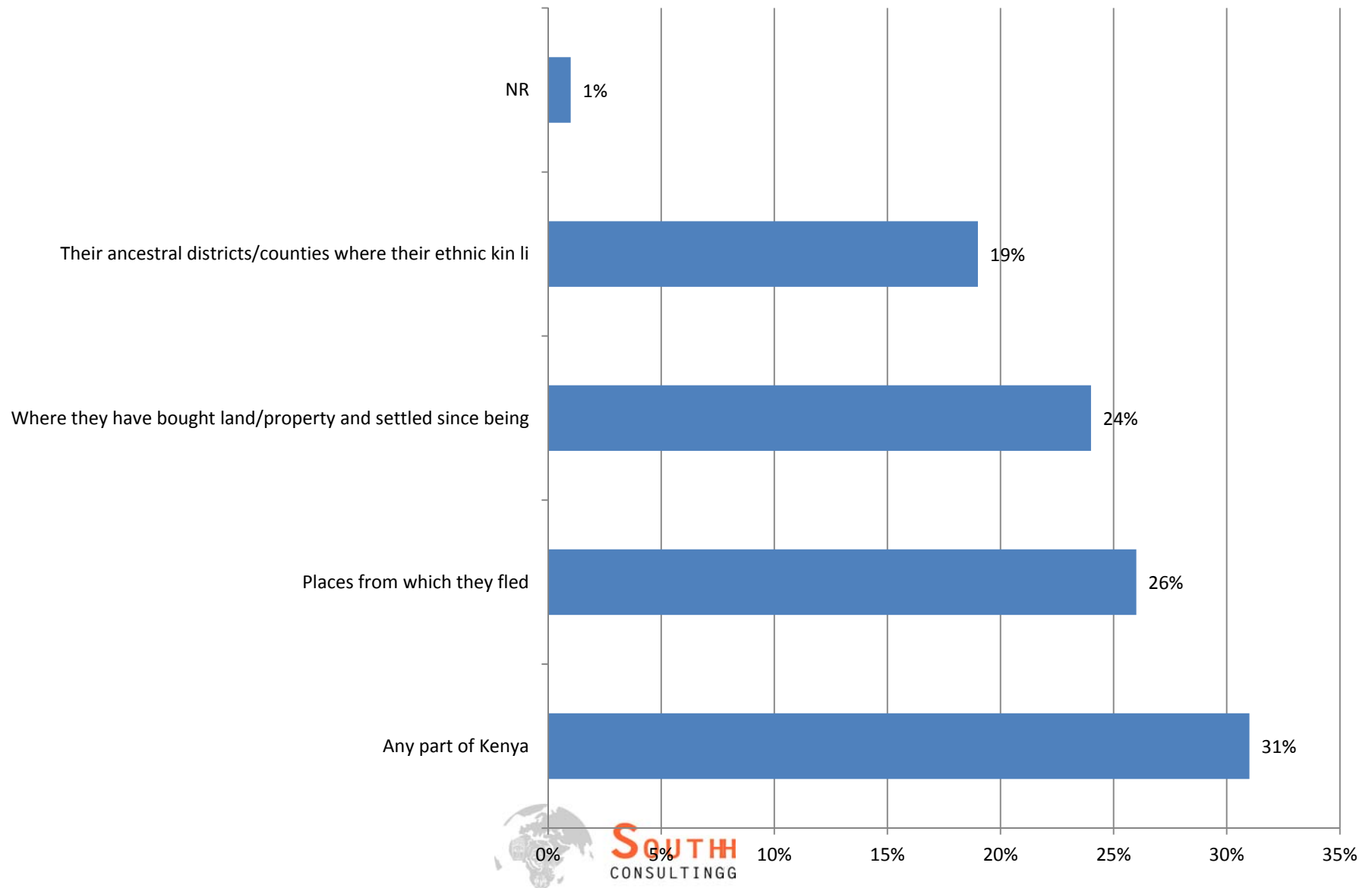


Do you think IDP are able to enjoy the following rights as citizens of Kenya? (by Total)

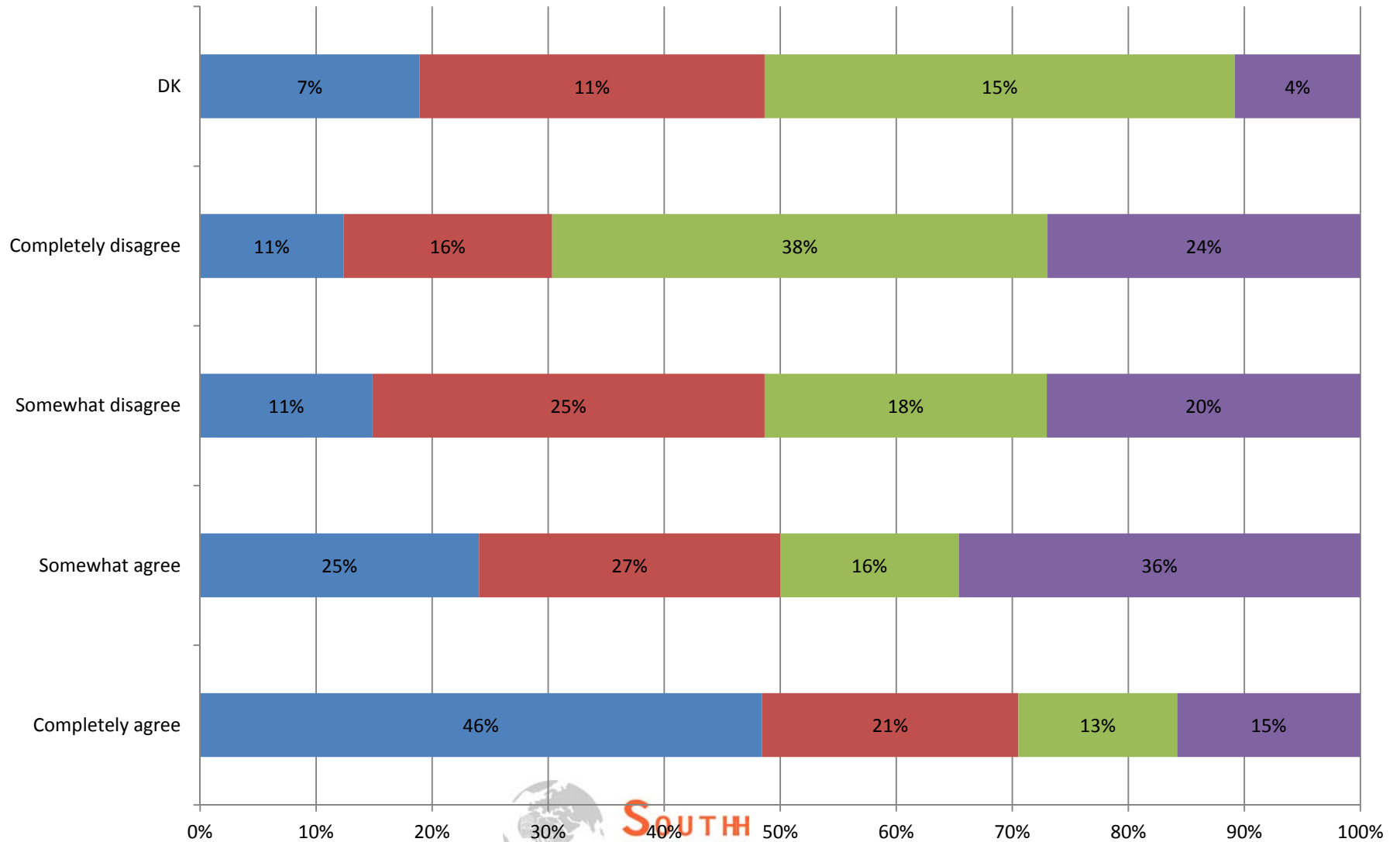


Which of the following do you consider to be the home of IDPs in Kenya? (by Total)



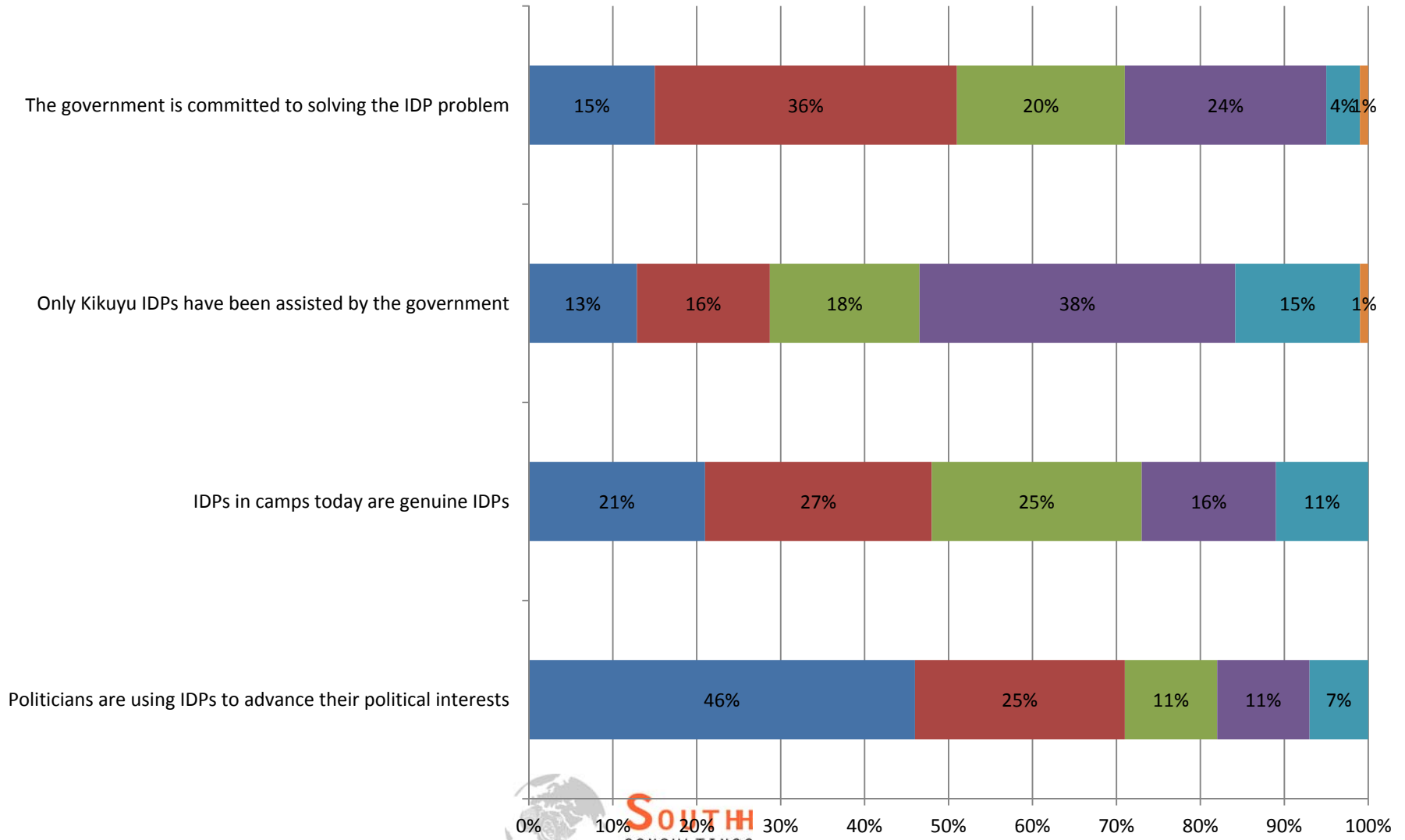
